1	On p. 27 of RFP, all Home Visiting programs are required to do ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE. What if these screenings are being done by other agencies, e.g., by MIHP or Family Futures? Should we duplicate those screenings?	In your proposal explain how the requirement is being met. Include the agency who is supporting ASQ in your narrative and in the section that lists partnerships. For the situations when ASQ data is being collected by a partner, we will have a conversation during the contracting process to determine which party should be submitting data. Duplicate data should not be submitted. We encourage agencies funded by Ready by Five to continue to partner in this way!	RFP 3, Program Type 1, p. 27
2	For RFP 8, on page 50, can you clarify the meaning of this: "Training developed for agencies outside of the Ready by Five network will not be considered this round."	In the RFP we define who trainings are applicable to including, "the broad audience of early childhood professionals across programs including but not limited to, social workers, community health workers, play and learn coaches, nurses, navigators, behavioral health clinicians, and home visitors." To clarify, the statement: Training developed for the sole purpose of training professionals outside this network will not be considered. Additionally, agencies will not be reimbursed any training session(s) provided to agency staff outside of the Ready by Five network.	RFP 8, Part II, p. 50
3	Assuming voters will renew EC Millage, will the 2025 application process be similar to 2024 (i.e., a full proposal and competitive) or will it be a streamlined process for programs funded in 2024?	We anticipate there will be similarities. As of this time the details related to the upcoming millage are still being determined. Once language regarding the next "ask" to voters is confirmed, we can determine the process for the upcoming 2025 application process.	N/A

The RFP seeks to enhance the capabilities of the current GSQ site. We recognize that the more "real time" component that shows where child care slots are available is not fully functional in a way that is helpful to families, navigators, or the community. Within the RFP there is also a staffing component that is included that will ensure there is support for families and navigators looking to be connected to child care availability and child-care related resources. 6	For 'Current Number-Program Staff' are you looking only for staff positions funded within the proposal?	For the Attachment A: Agency Staff and Leadership Diversity section of the application, include <i>all</i> agency staff. This is the section where proposing agencies will complete a matrix form. For the Budget Narrative section of the application, include only the staff positions that are included in the proposal Budget.	All RPFs
7	What is cost sharing? Could you provide an example of cost sharing revenue and leveraging it for a service?	More information about cost sharing can be found in the Ready by Five Service Provider Manual on page 63 and the updates for 2023 begin on page 90. Check Section Two, Part III of each RFP to determine if this is required for your Service Type. Cost Sharing is based on family income. Families with income above 200% Federal Poverty Level will be required to pay based on a sliding scale for some services funded by the Ready by Five Early Childhood Millage. All funds collected through cost sharing will be used as the "first dollar" towards services and will increase the amount of funding available to Service Providers. 		An example: If a family of four has an annual income higher than 200% Federal Poverty Level and is interested in home visiting services, the provider would collect payment for services based on the Ready by Five Cost Sharing Policy. This cost share payment would be applied as a source of revenue towards the cost of the home visiting program and reported to Ready by Five as collected income. This collected payment would be leveraged and used in addition to the millage funds awarded.

Letters of Support are to be submitted for the organization as a whole and should provide support for the organization being qualified to provide quality services to expecting parents and families with children through age five in Kent County. We are assuming that your question referenced Ready by Five PPF (Prioritizing Parent Fund) awards. A requirement of the PPF funding was that initiatives will not begin or expand services beyond the level that can be realistically maintained for the following fiscal year. However, for this round of proposals Ready by Five is seeking proposals from agencies who engage and empower families as partners to shape the direction of program delivery. If the engagement activities currently supported by PPF specifically serve the purpose of "engaging and empowering families as partners" within your program model, the related (reasonable) expenses will be considered for the upcoming proposal. Additional funds for Prioritizing Parent initiatives are not guaranteed as of this time. Funds may be available, but this depends on factors such as if there are remaining funds available and if the Ready by Five Resident Proposal Review Board determines the necessity for these funds to be continued. Ready by Five Early Childhood Millage funds may not be used to purchase equipment or property. Computers and technology costing \$1,000 and over per unit are considered equipment and not an allowable cost for programs applying for funding under the current RFPs. Computers and technology costing \$999.99 and under per unit are allowable with the following contingencies. If awarded, the agency will be required to provide a description of: • your agency's internal controls are in place to track the technology as it is assigned to staff and/or program participants, and • how your agency plans to safeguard sensitive information that may be housed on the technology. 19.	If we weren't funded in FY2022, we don't need to share any demographic data for our newest application?	If your program is a brand-new program and has no history of serving individuals, include details about who your program intends to reach in the field towards the bottom of the spreadsheet attachment (row 37). This field is titled, "Include additional specification of groups demographics your program intends to reach". First Steps Kent highly suggests that if this is a program that has been up and running for at least a year (even if it was not funded by the Ready by Five Millage), that you provide information about the demographics of individuals served in 2022 and the groups your program intends to serve in 2024. Either way, the Resident Proposal Review board will be looking for information about how your program will reach the groups/geographies included in the proposal. In the narrative section under "Service Delivery" include specifics in the question that "Please Describe your outreach plan for the proposed program" about how your program intends to reach and engage the geographies and groups included in the demographic description.
