

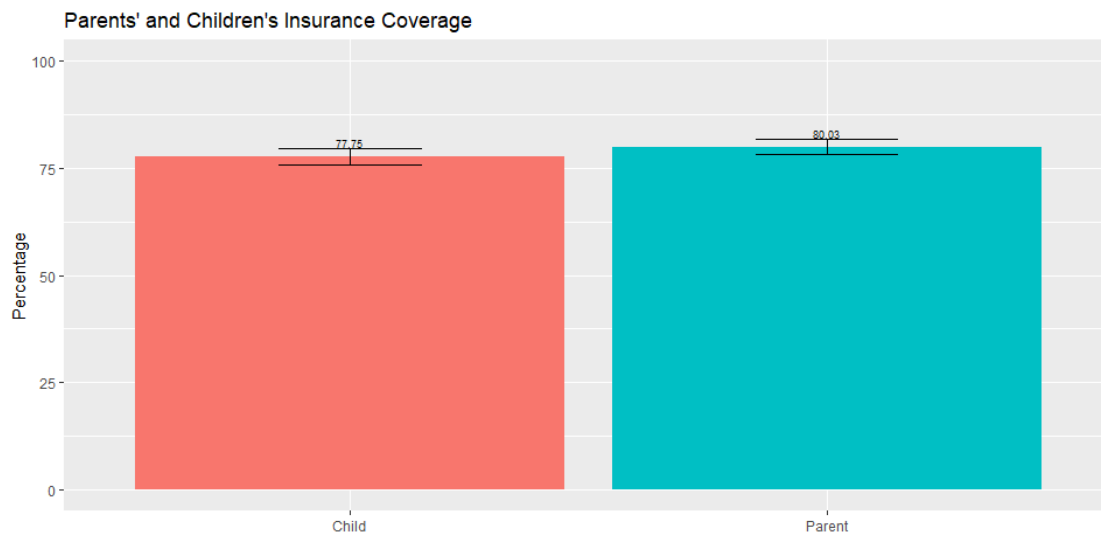

1. Insurance coverage

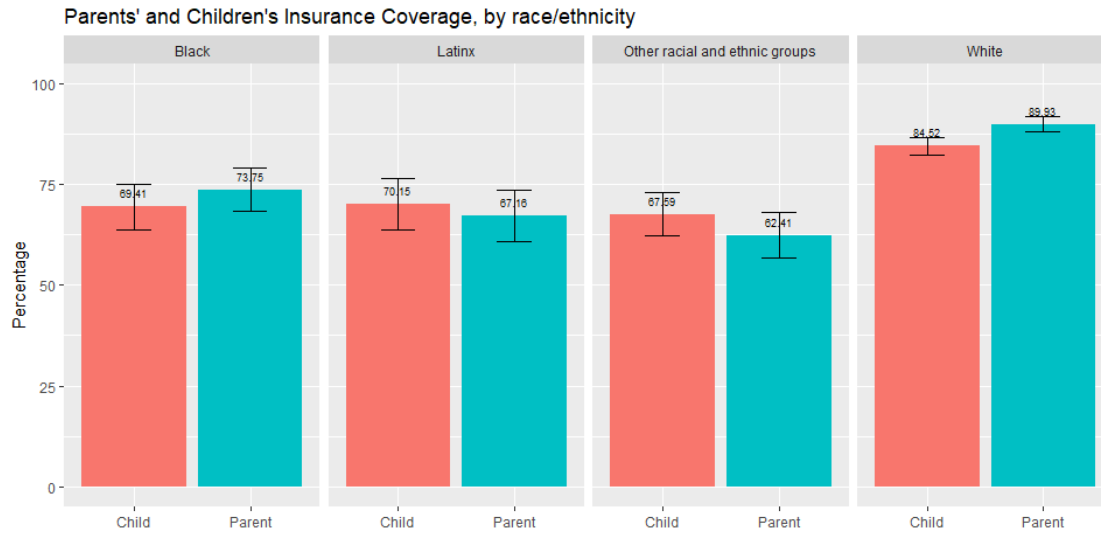
1.1 Whether covered by insurance

- Note: insurance questions were only asked in the initial recruitment surveys. Data are aggregated across surveys in this set of analyses.

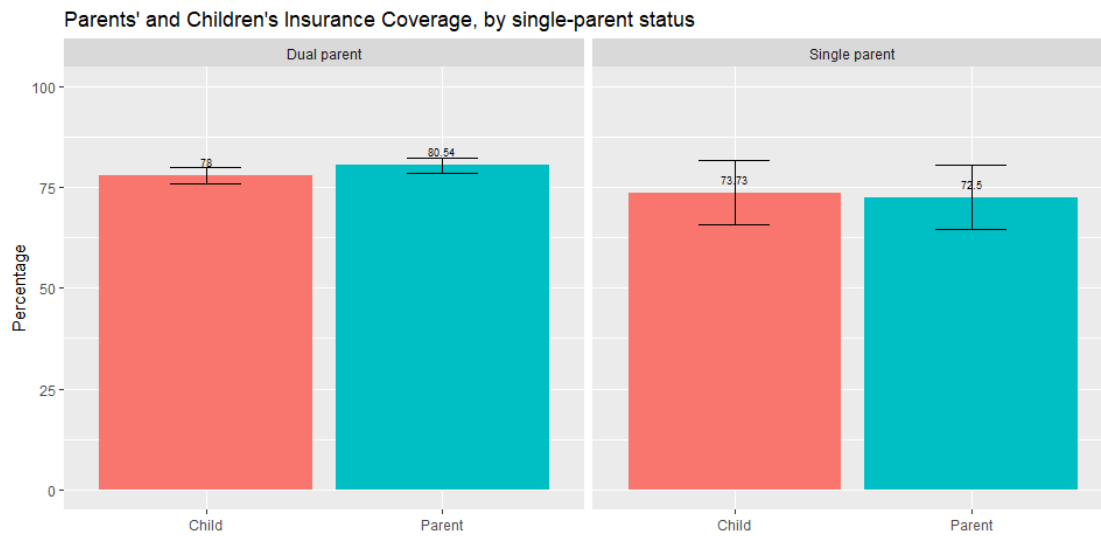

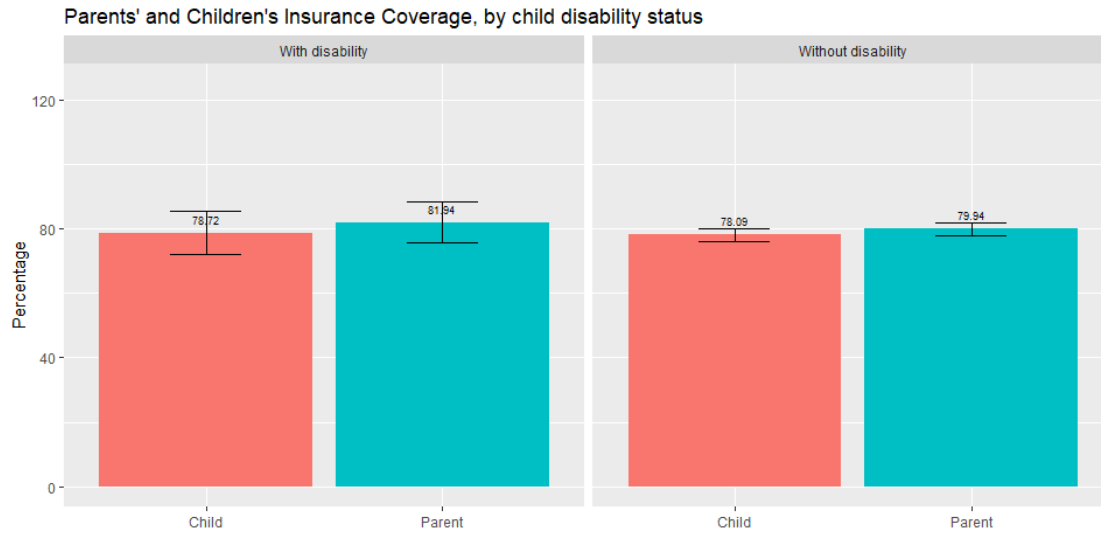
1.1.2 By Race/Ethnicity



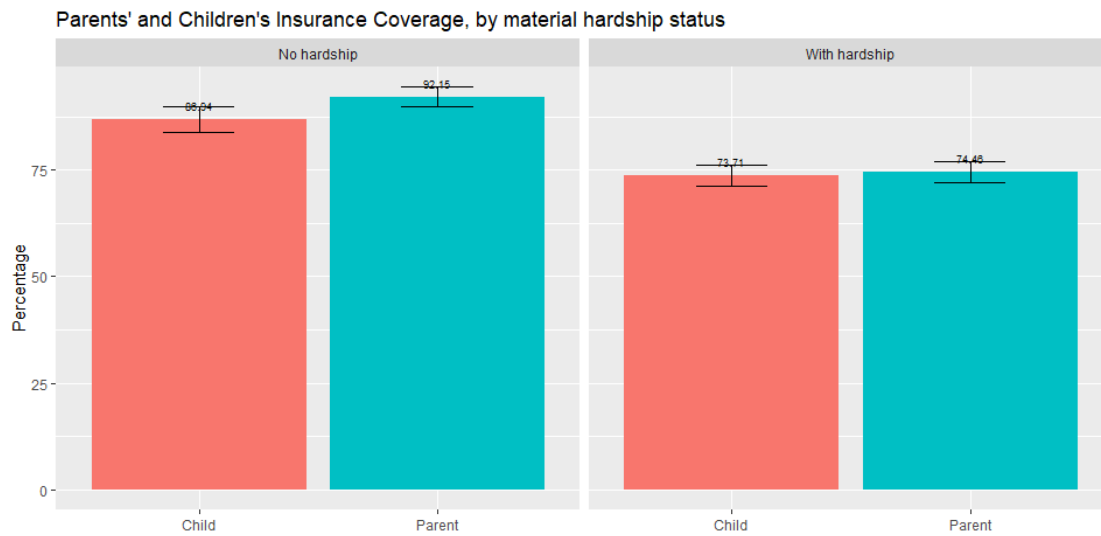

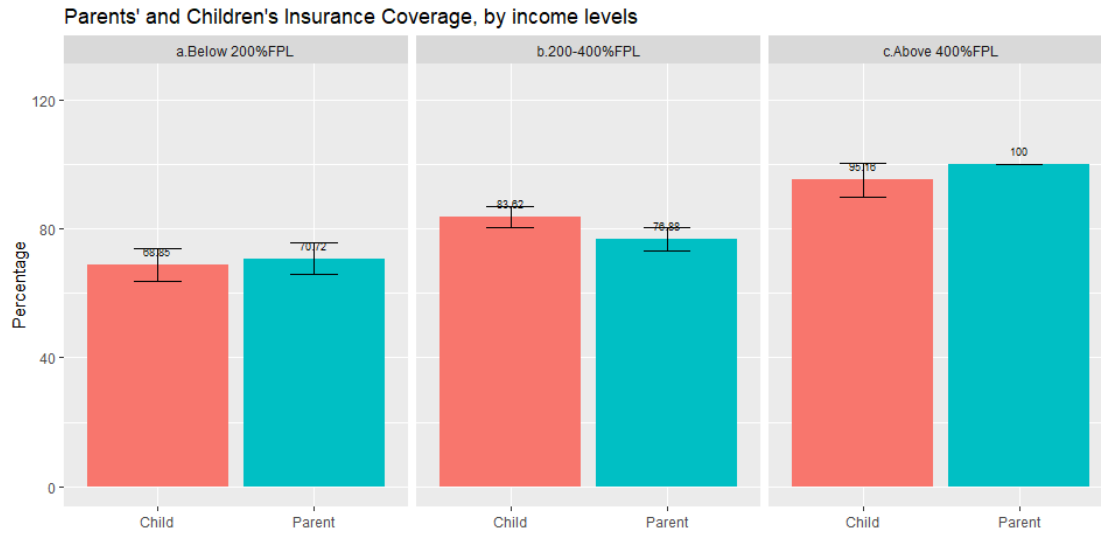

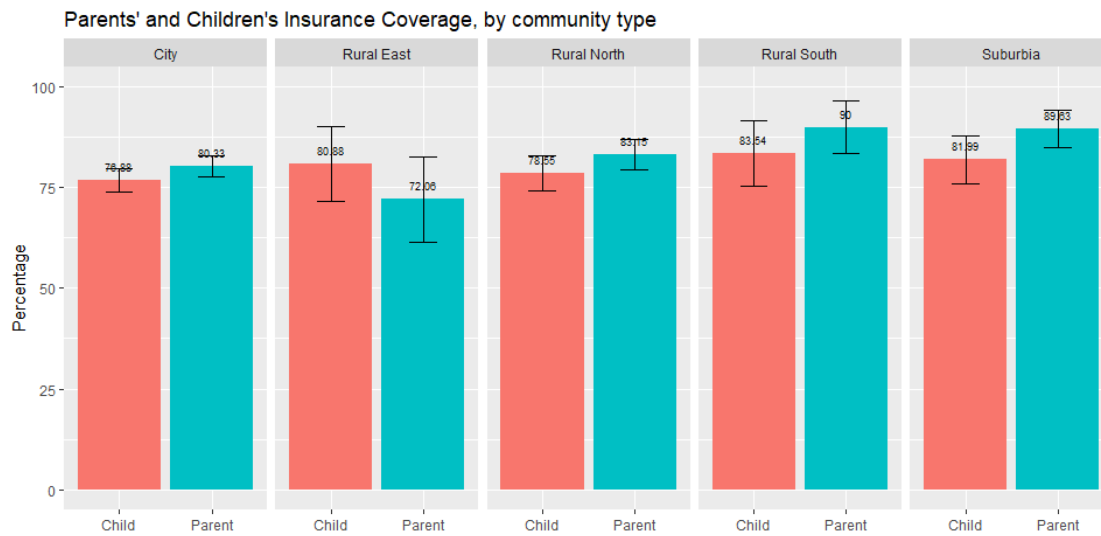

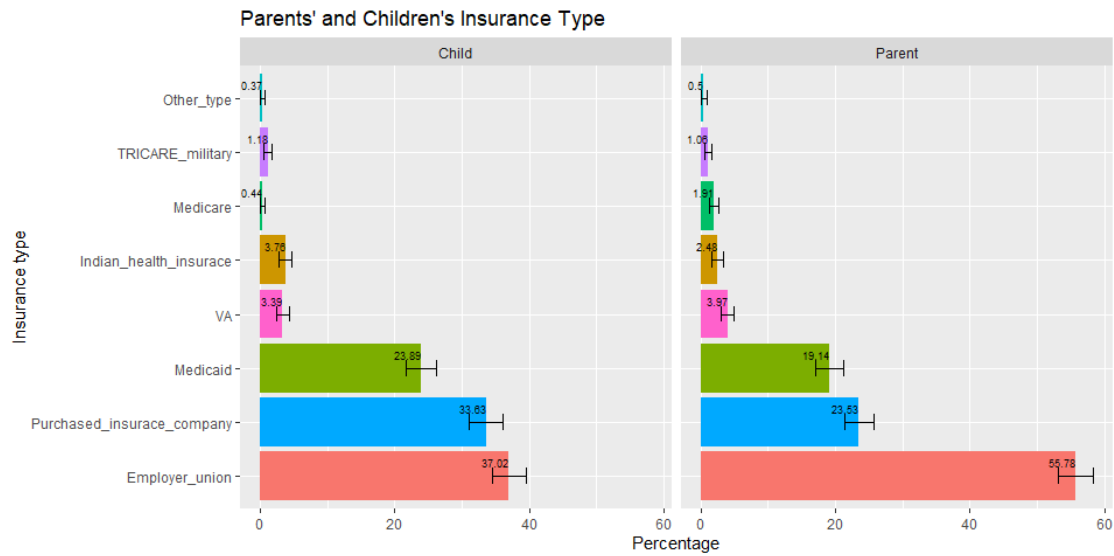

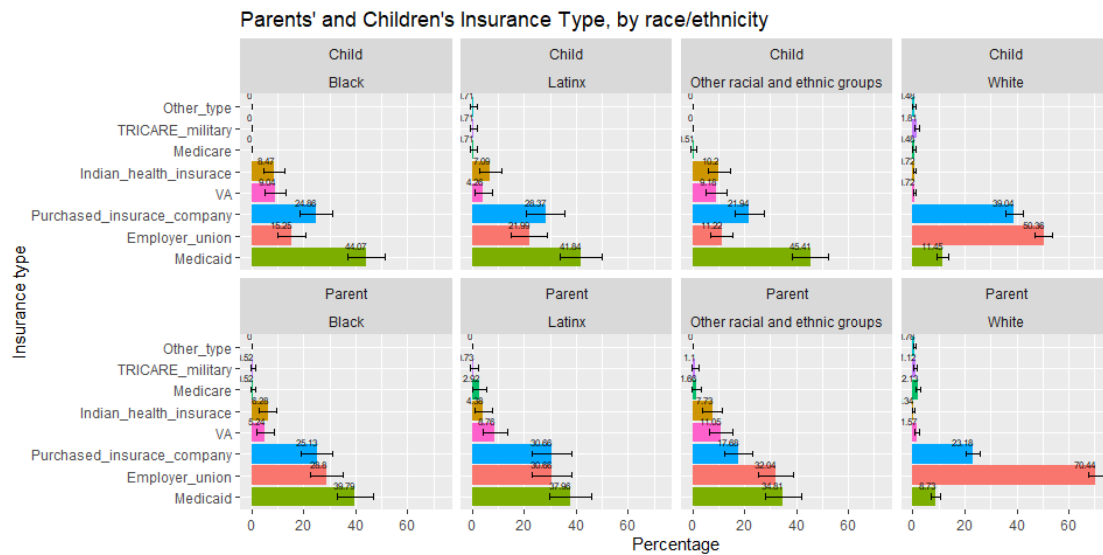
1.2 Type of insurance

 - Insurance purchased from an insurance company (by you or another family member)
 - Medicare, for people 65 and older, or people with certain disabilities
 - Medicaid, Medical Assistance, or any kind of government-assistance plan for those with low incomes or a disability
 - TRICARE or other military healthcare
 - VA (enrolled for VA healthcare)
 - Indian Health Service
 - Any other type of health insurance or health coverage plane (Please Describe)
 - I don't know
- Analyses conducted only among those who reported having insurance

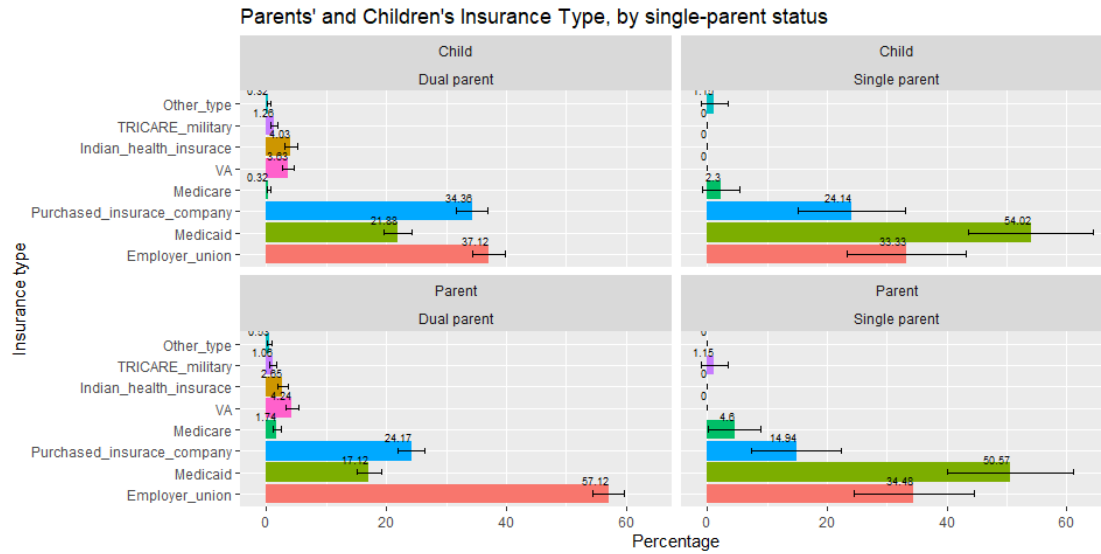

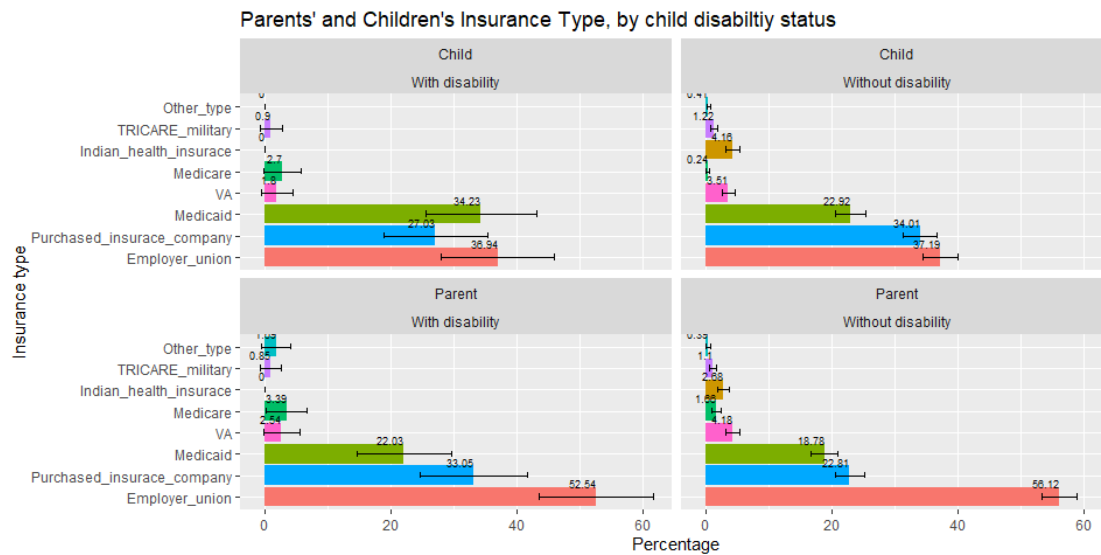
1.2.2 By Race/Ethnicity



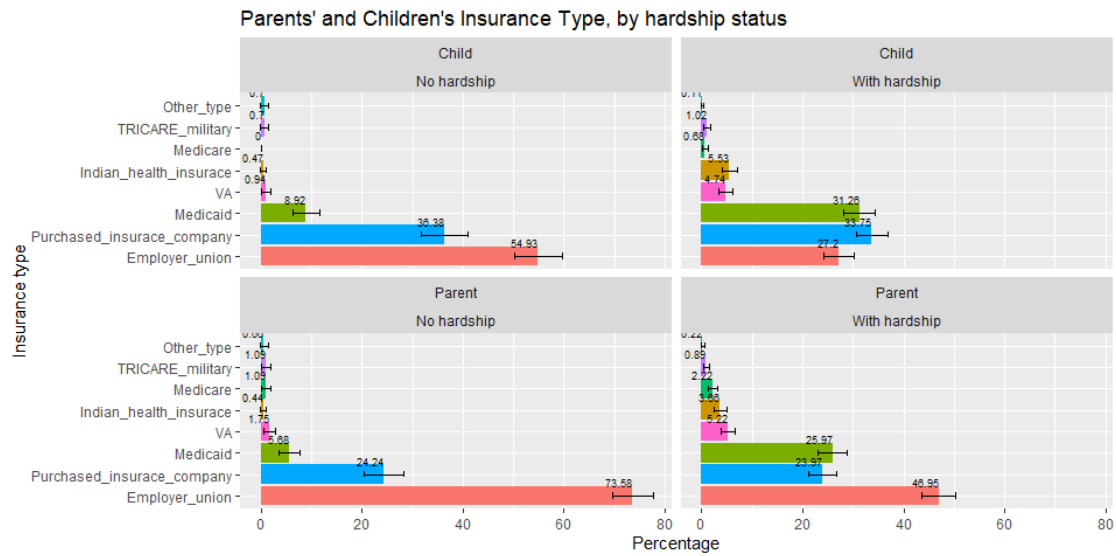

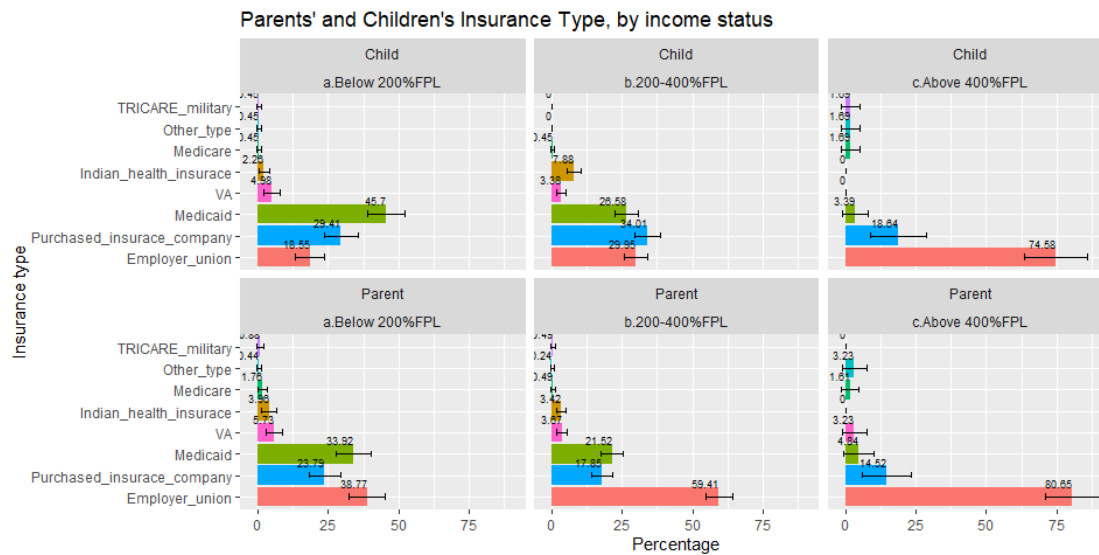

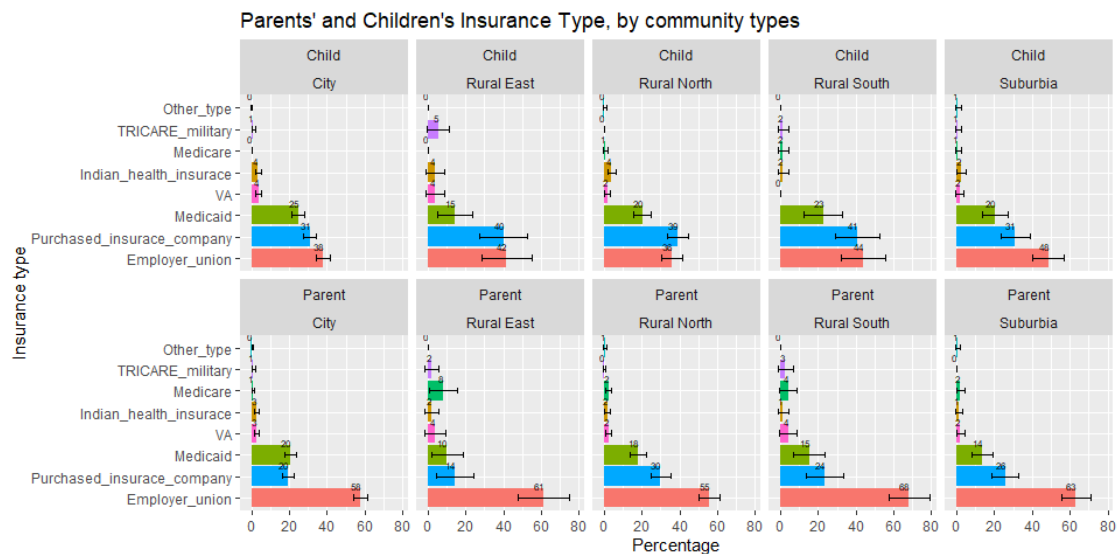

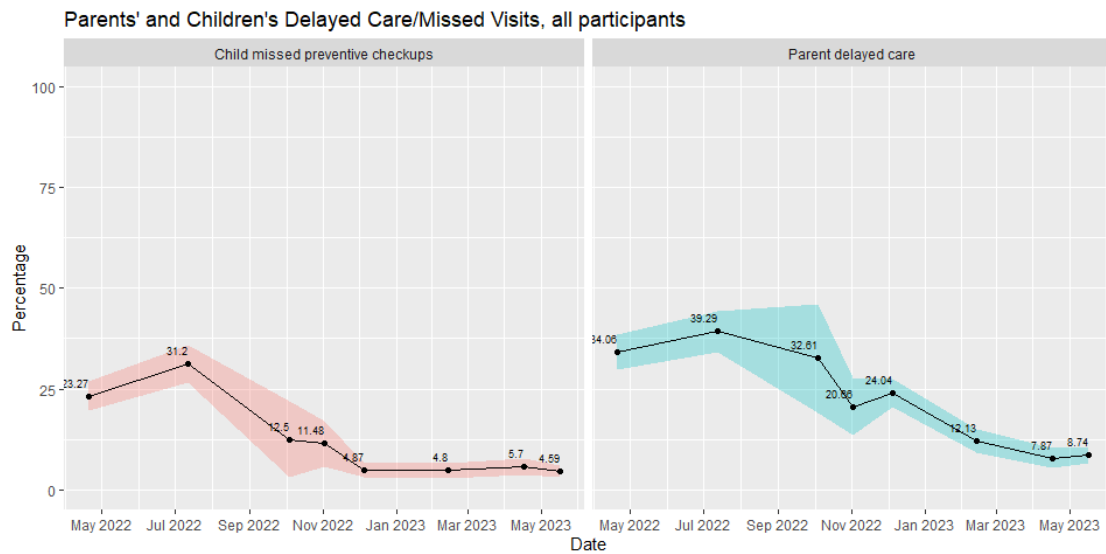

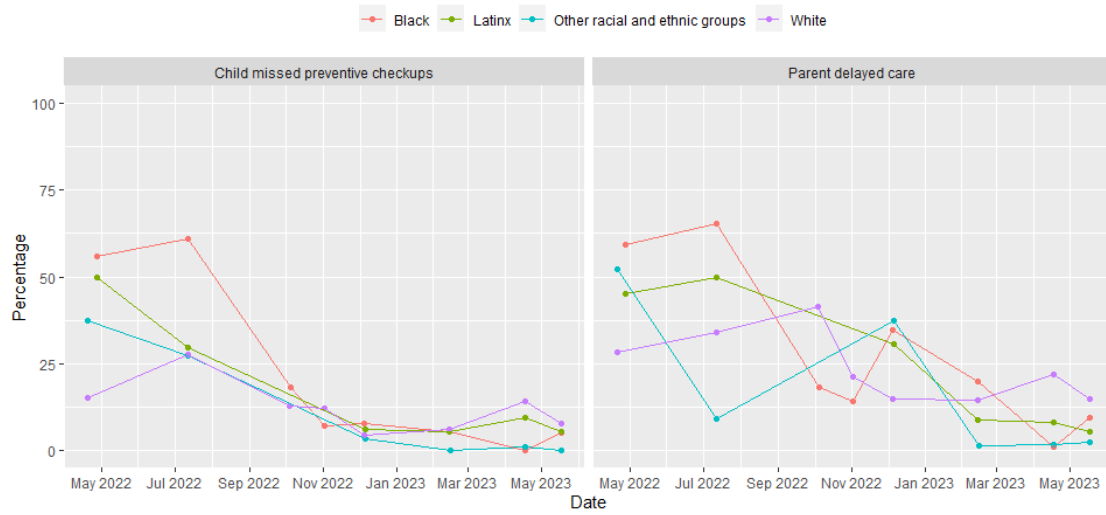

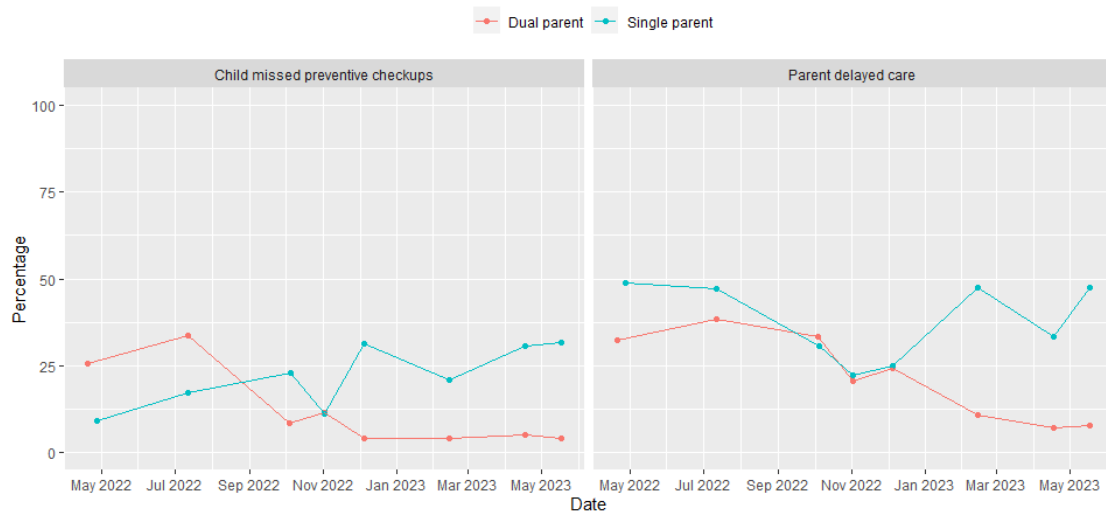

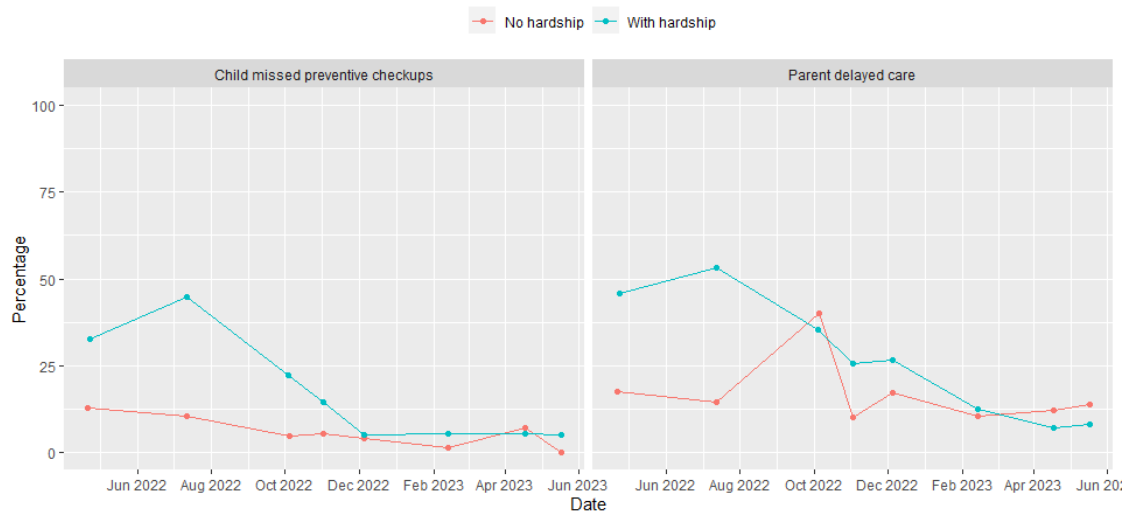

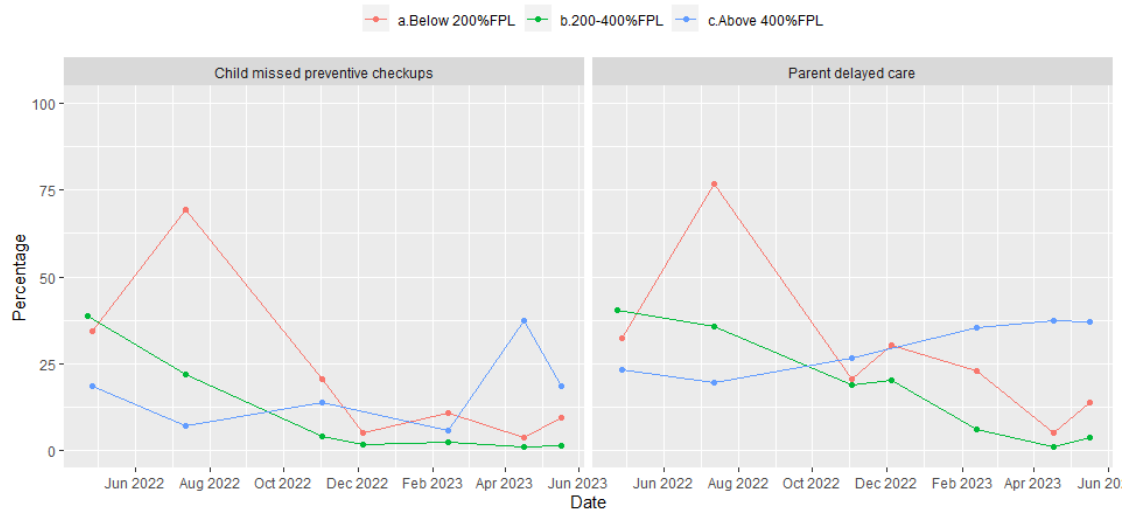
Parents' and Children's Delayed Care/Missed Visits, by material hardship status

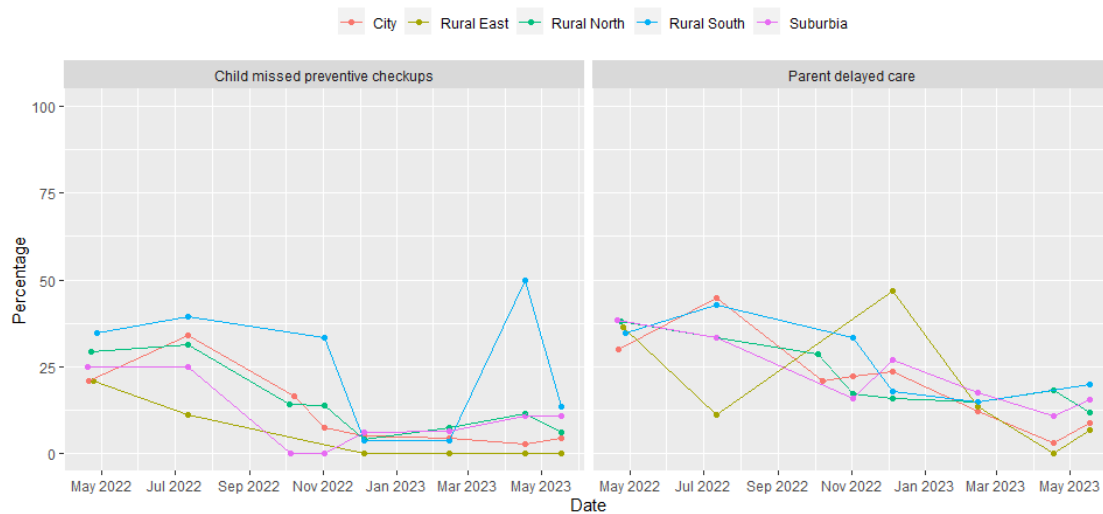
Parents' and Children's Delayed Care/Missed Visits, by income status

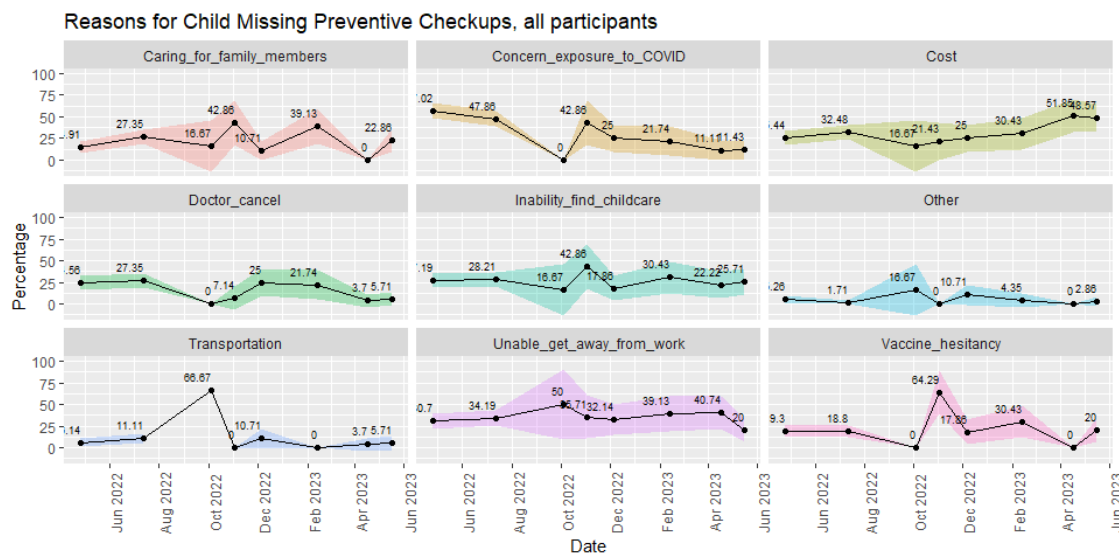
Parents' and Children's Delayed Care/Missed Visits, by community types



2.2 Reasons for missed child preventive checkups

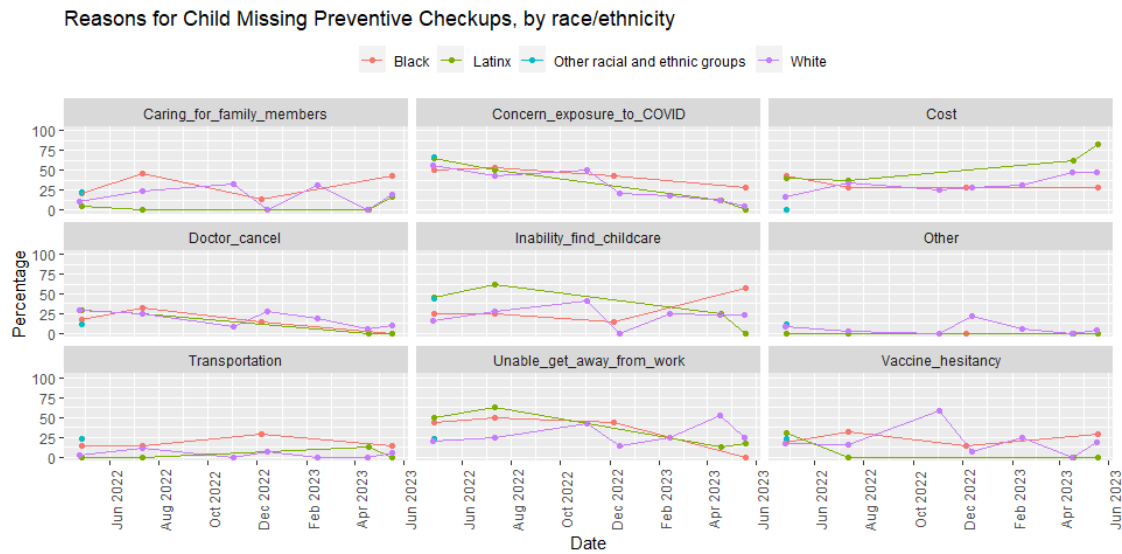
- Survey Question: Reasons prevented well baby checkup
 - Cost
 - Unable to get time away from work
 - Inability to find childcare
 - Concern over exposure to COVID-19
 - Caring for family members
 - Vaccine hesitancy
 - Doctor/clinic cancelled the visit
 - Transportation
 - Other
- Analyses conducted only among those who reported missing care/delayed care.
Sample size too small for child disability status and income level grouping analysis.

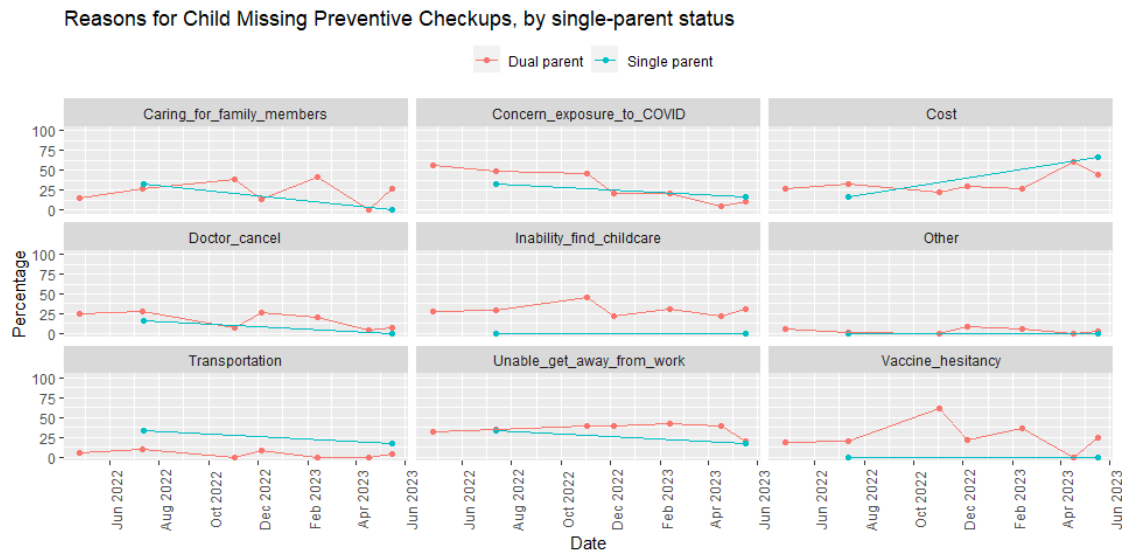

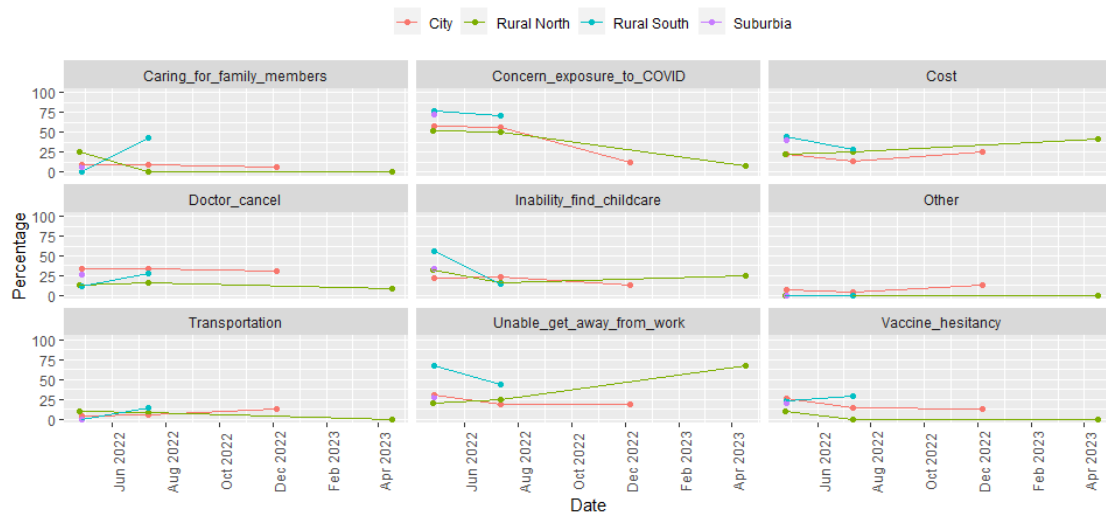
Reasons for Child Missing Preventive Checkups, by material hardship status

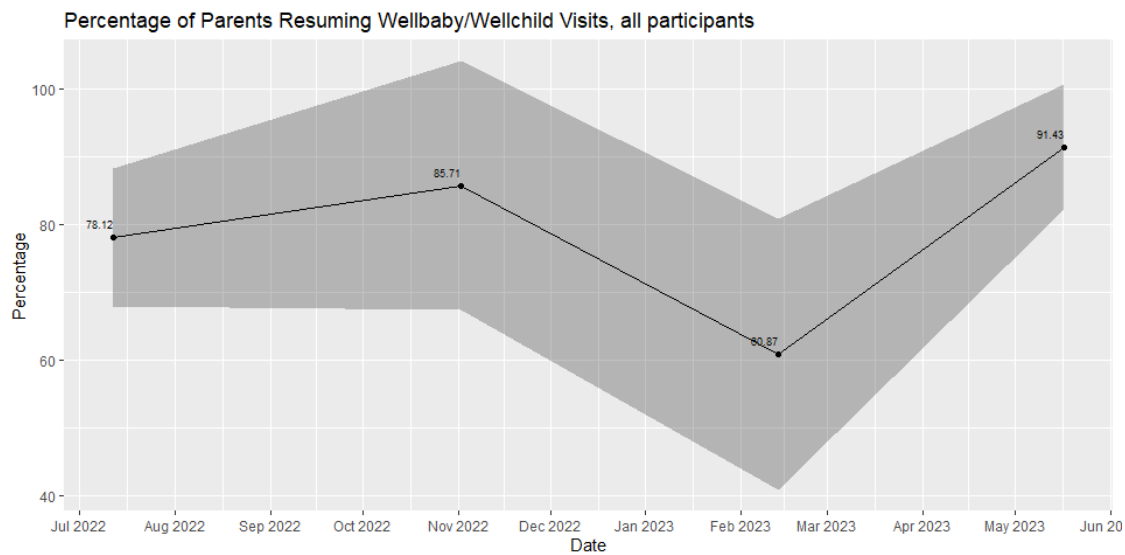
Reasons for Child Missing Preventive Checkups, by community types



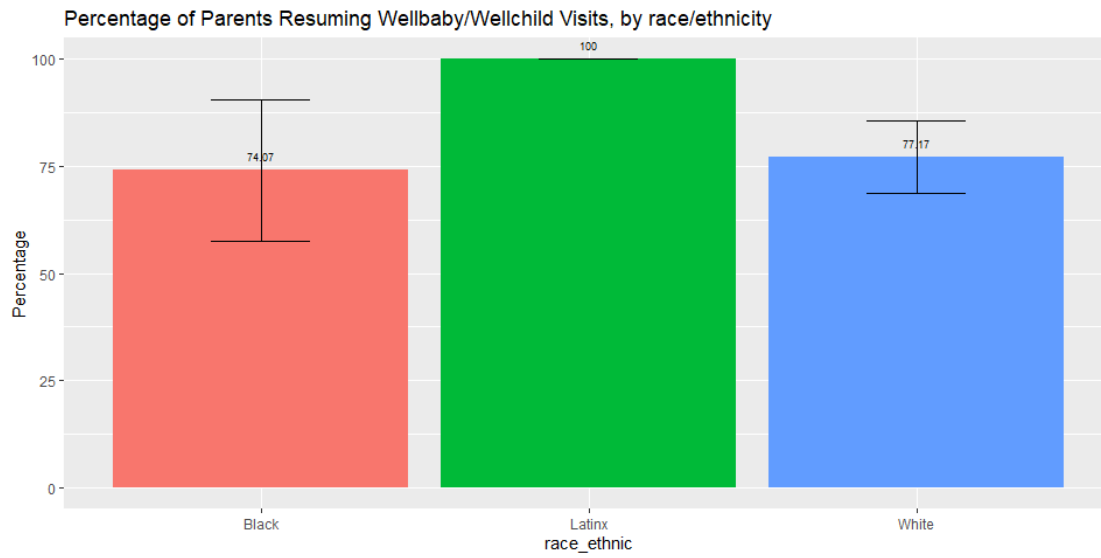
2.3 Resume Well-baby/Well-child Visits

Question only asked among those who reported missing well-baby/well-child visits

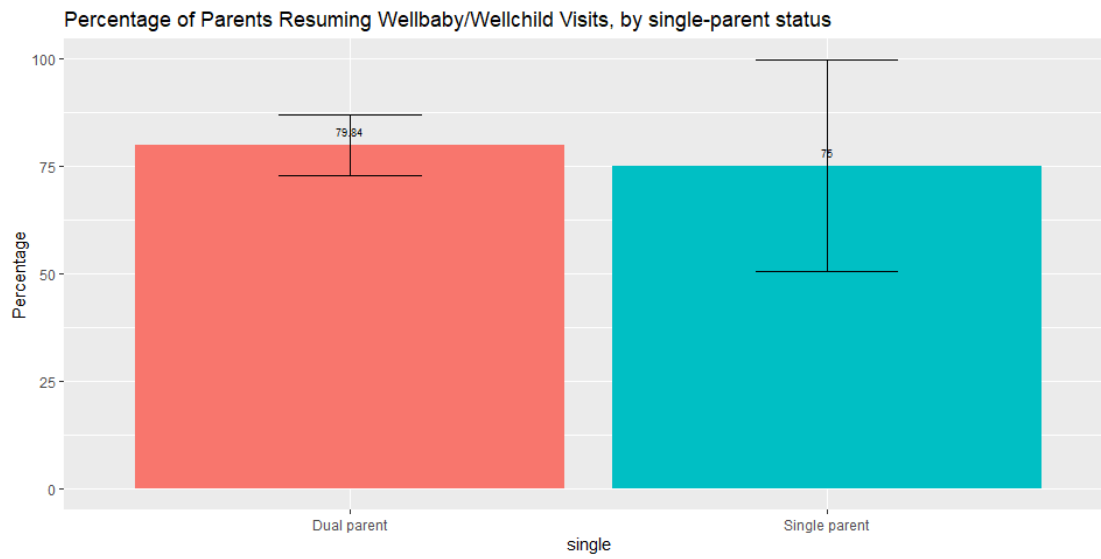

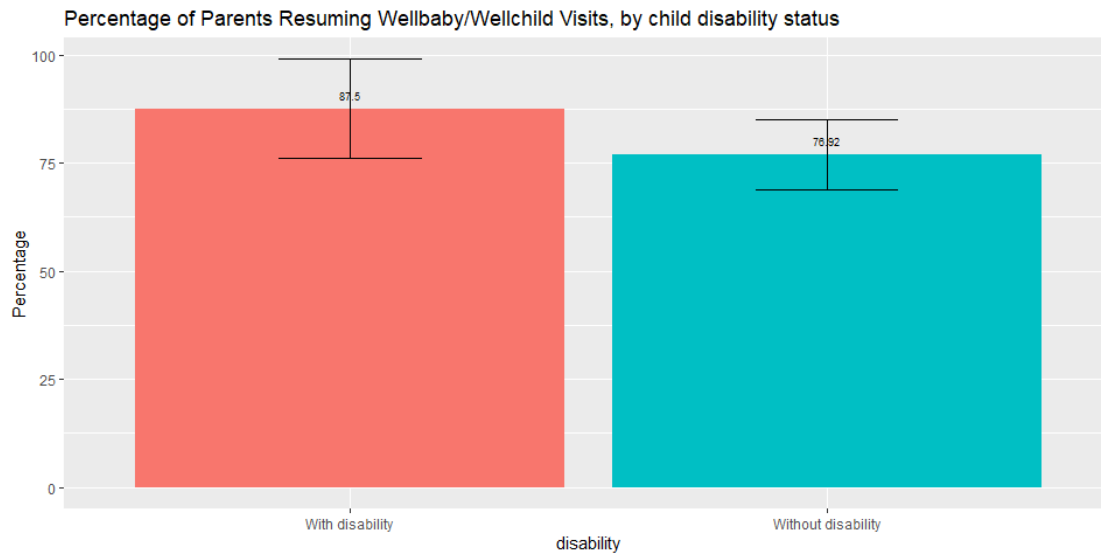

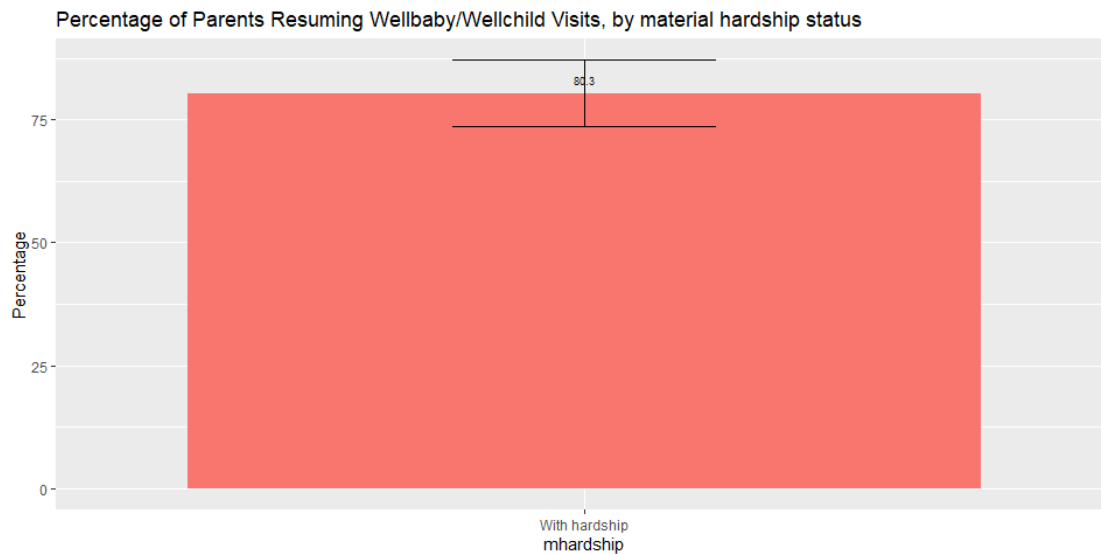
