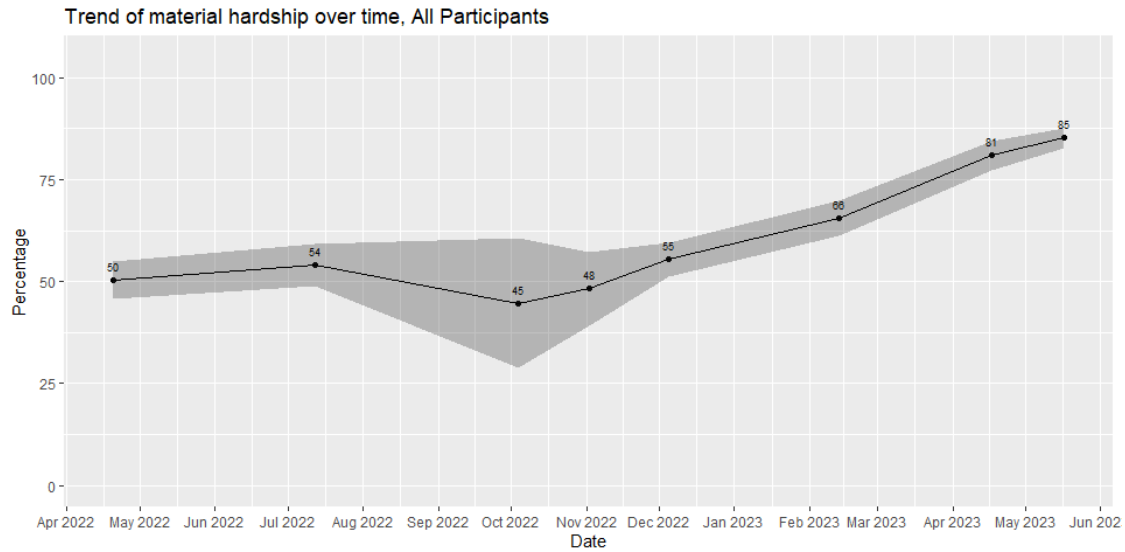

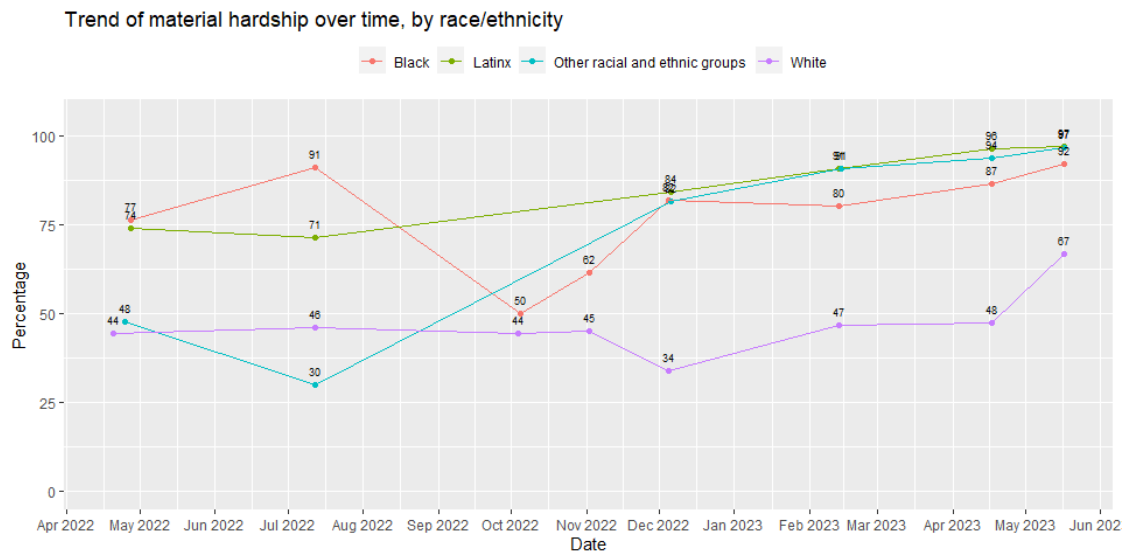

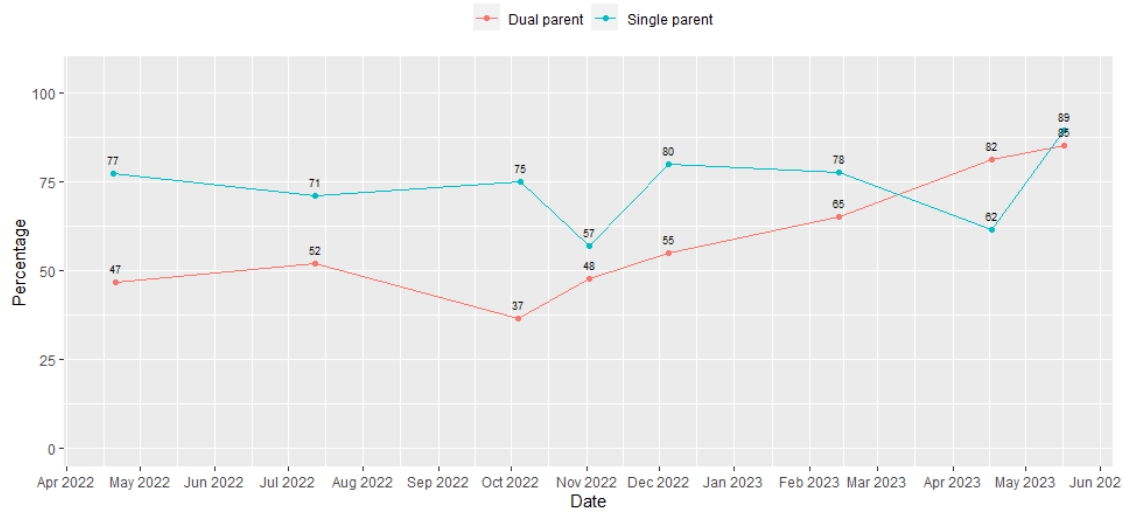

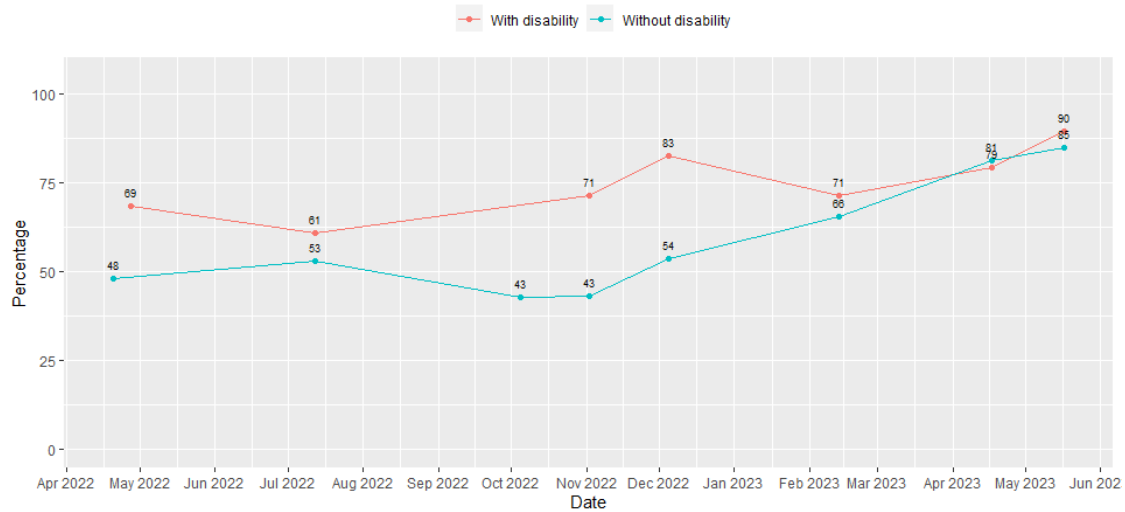
Trend of material hardship over time, by single-parent status

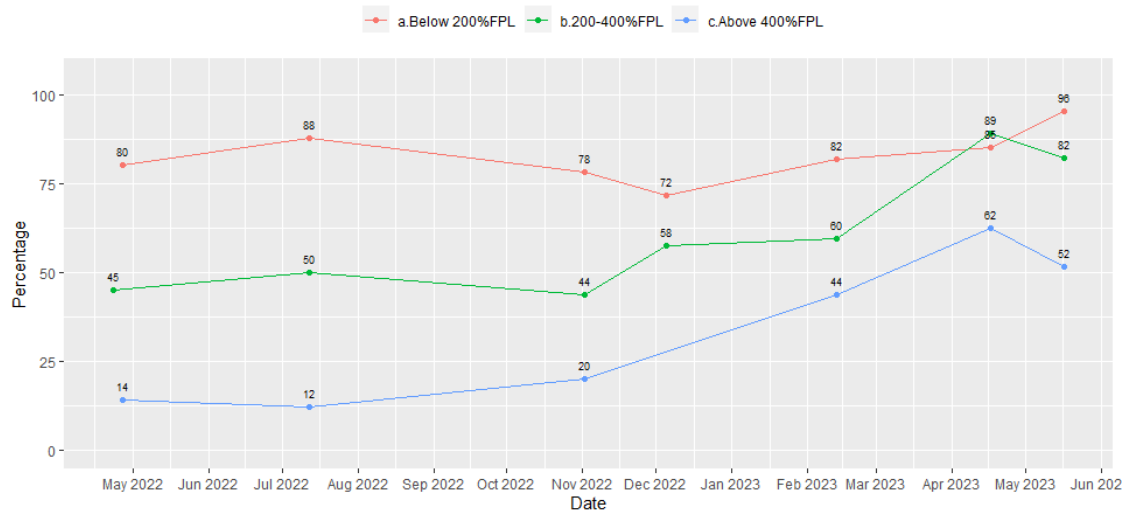

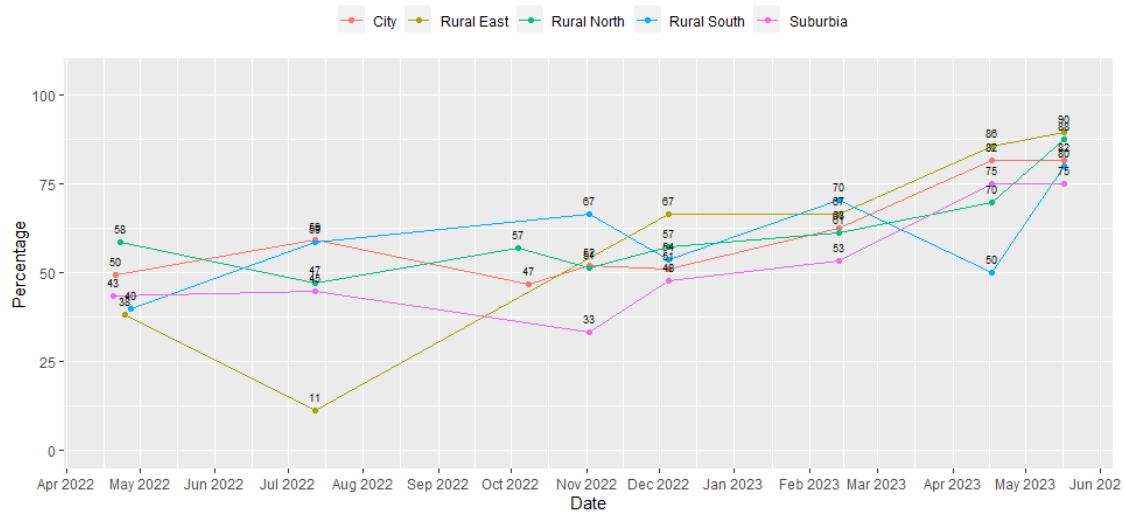
Trend of material hardship over time, by income levels

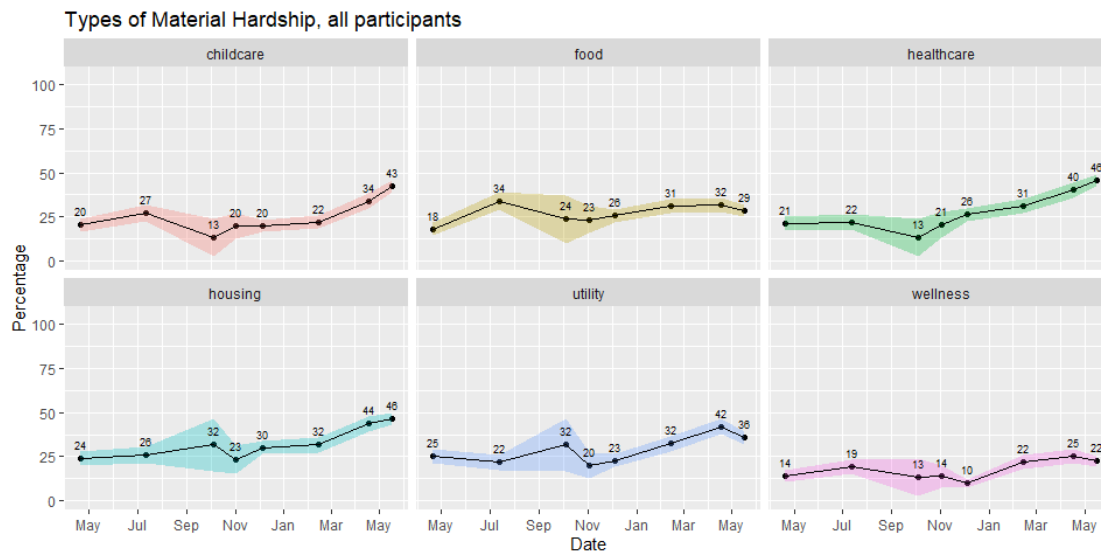

Trend of material hardship over time, by community types



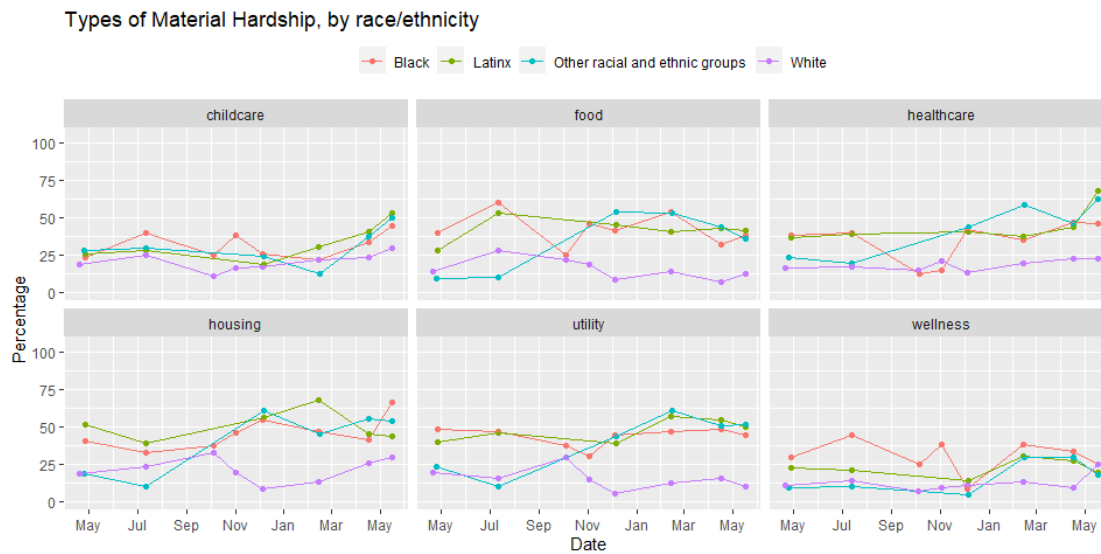

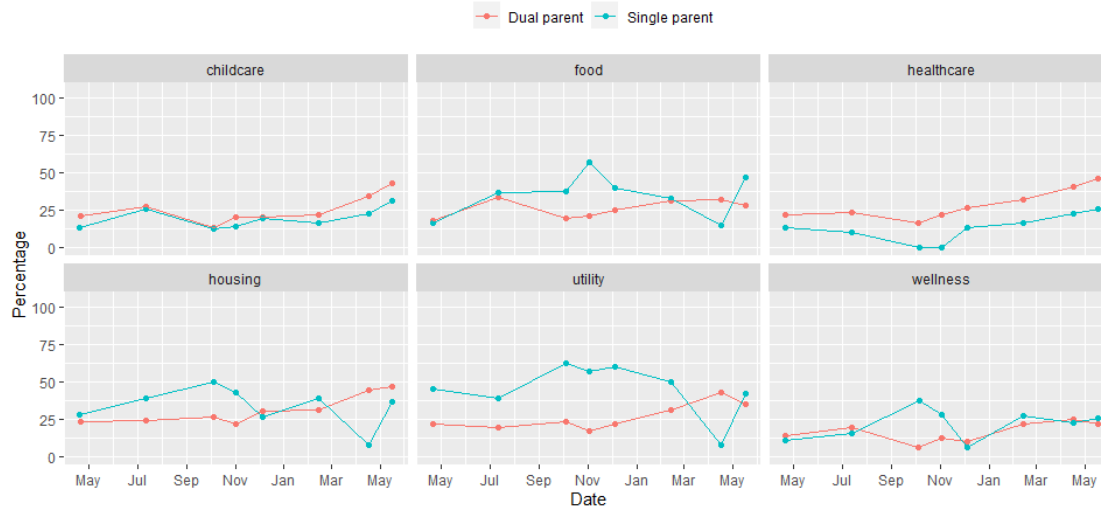

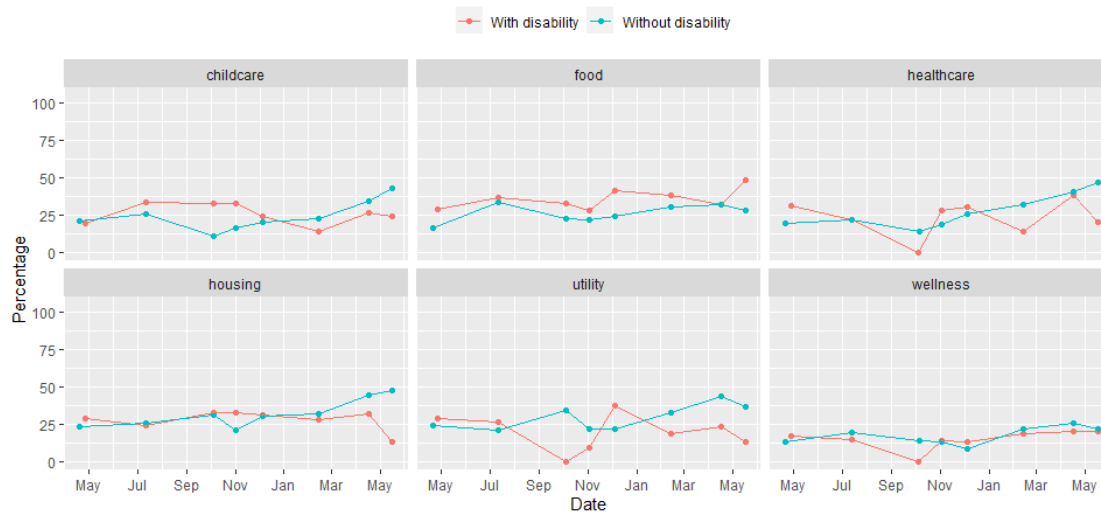
Types of Material Hardship, by single-parent status

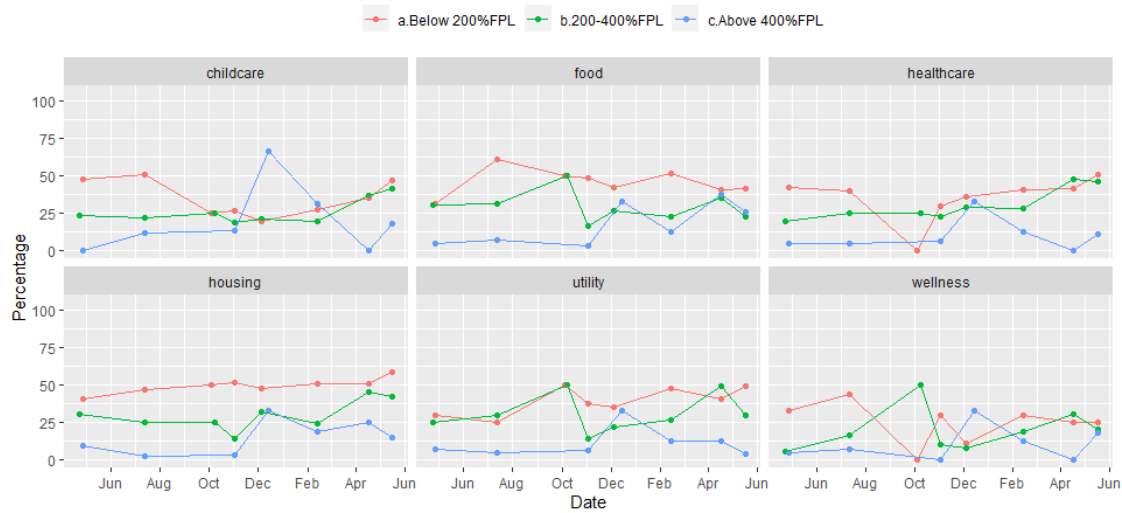
Types of Material Hardship, by child disability status

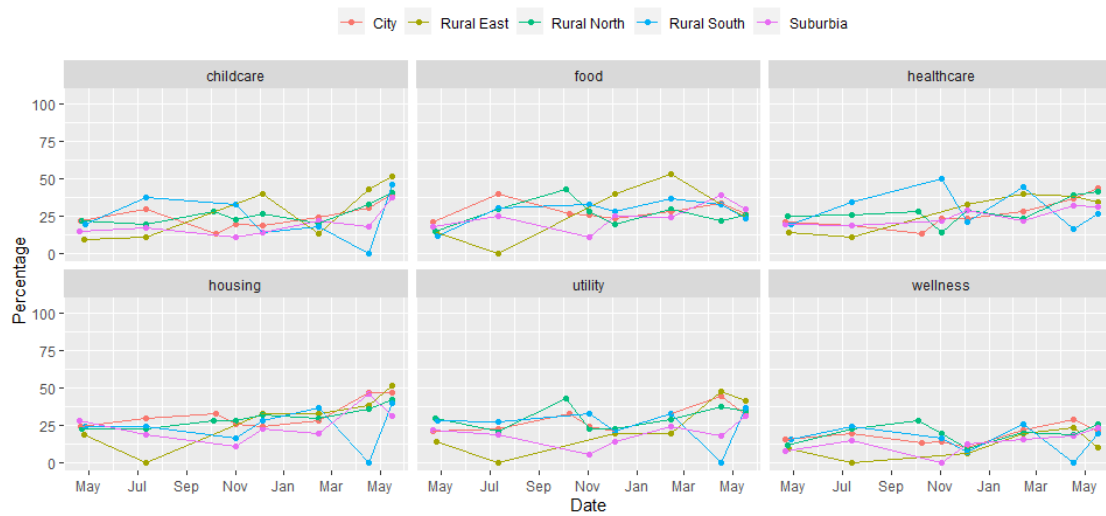

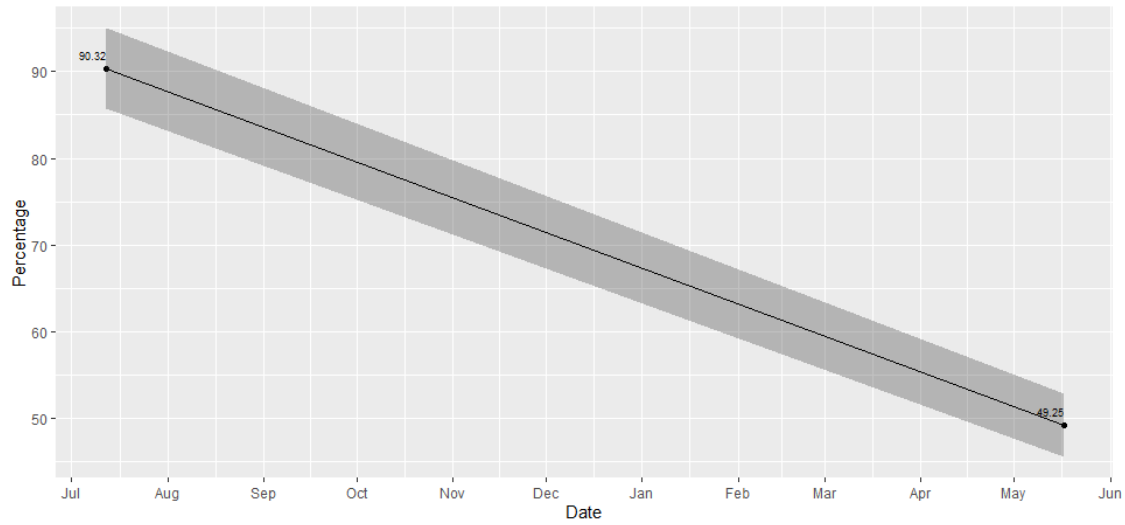

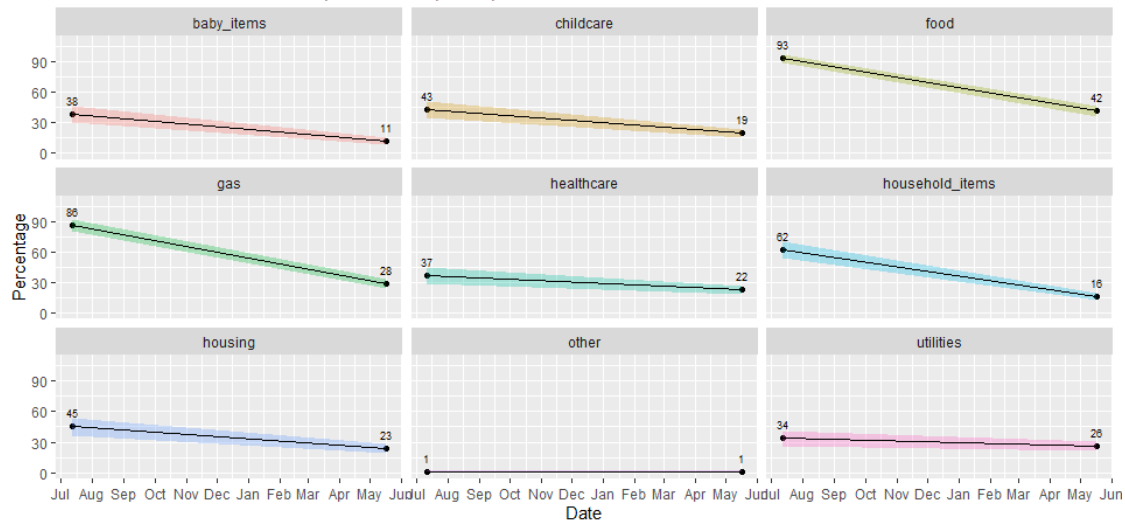

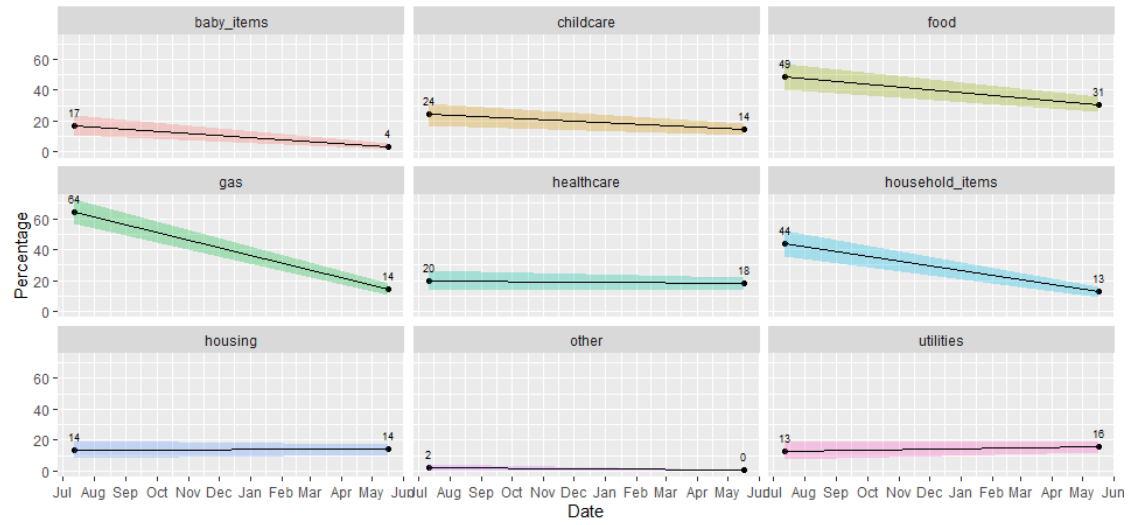
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, all participants



Items Have Become More Expensive, all participants

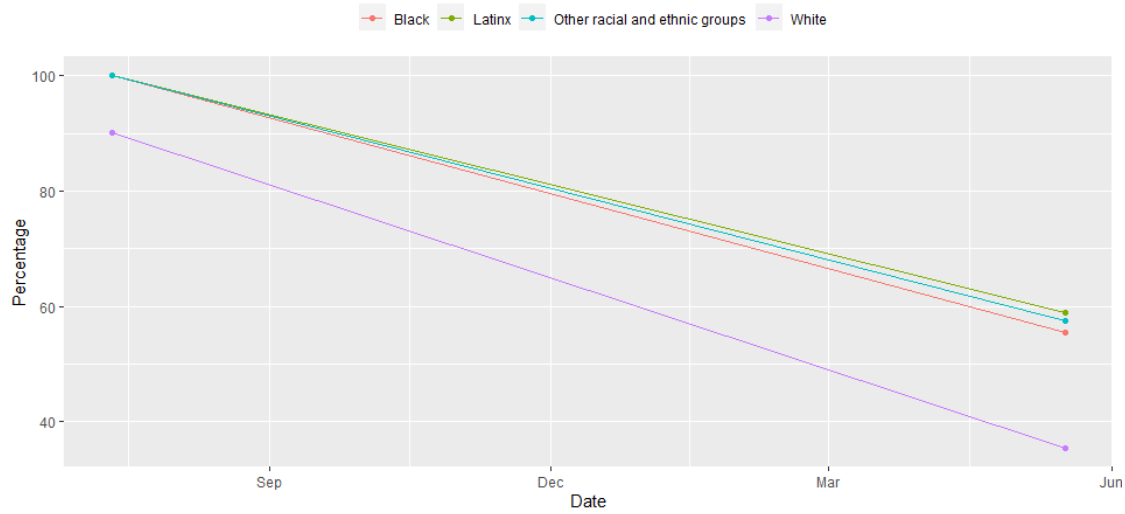

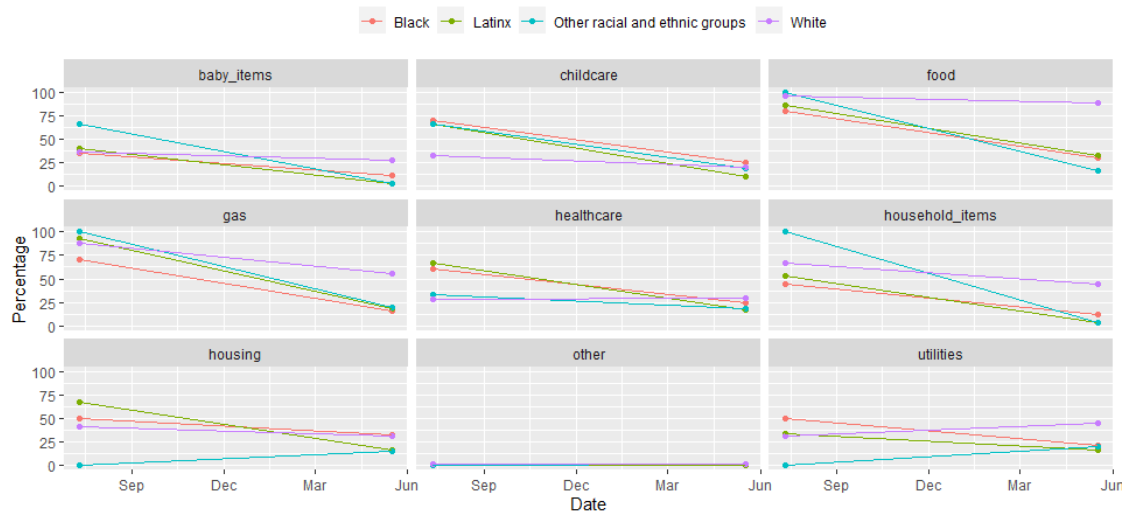

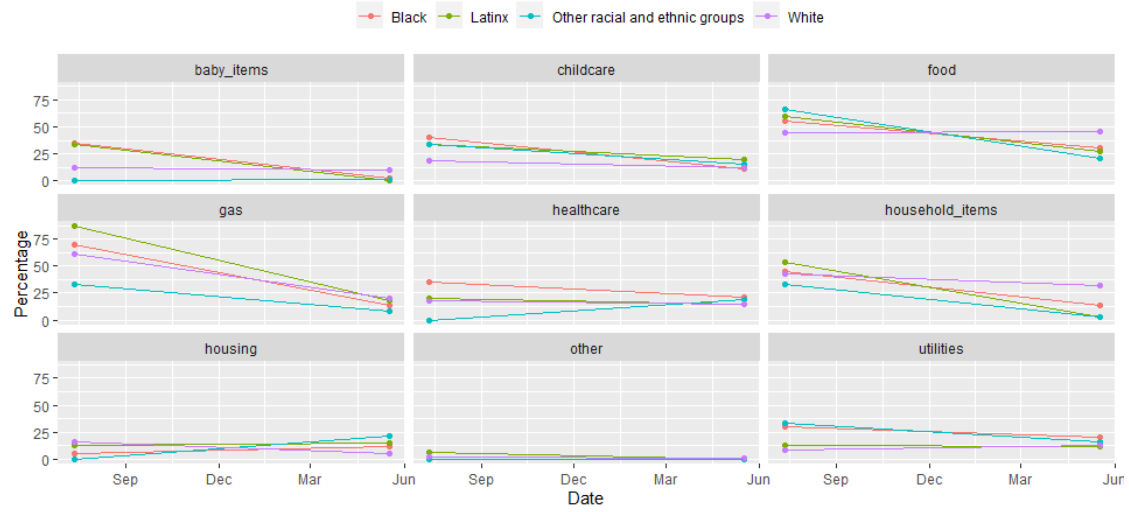
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, by race/ethnicity



Items Have Become More Expensive, by race/ethnicity

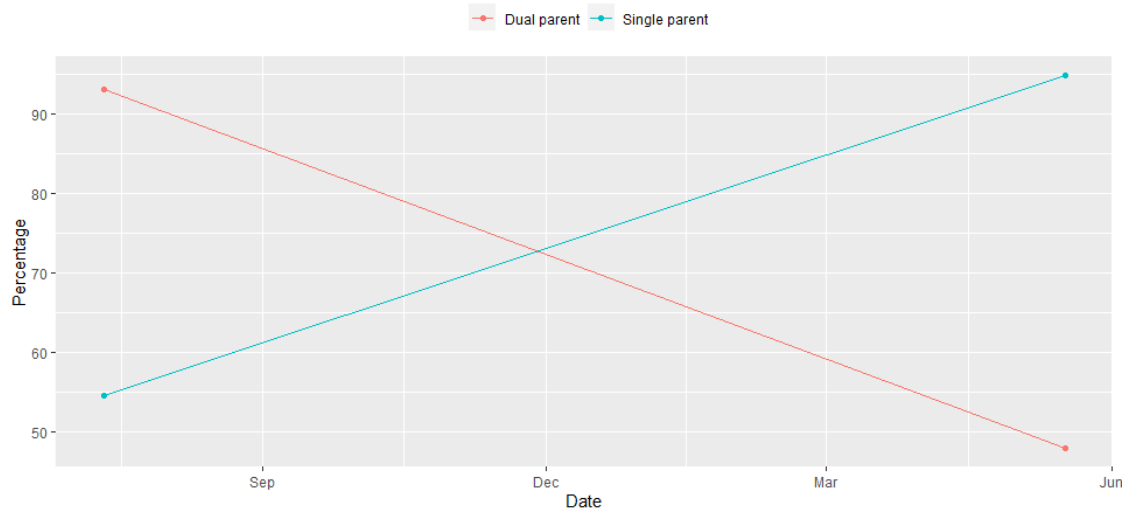

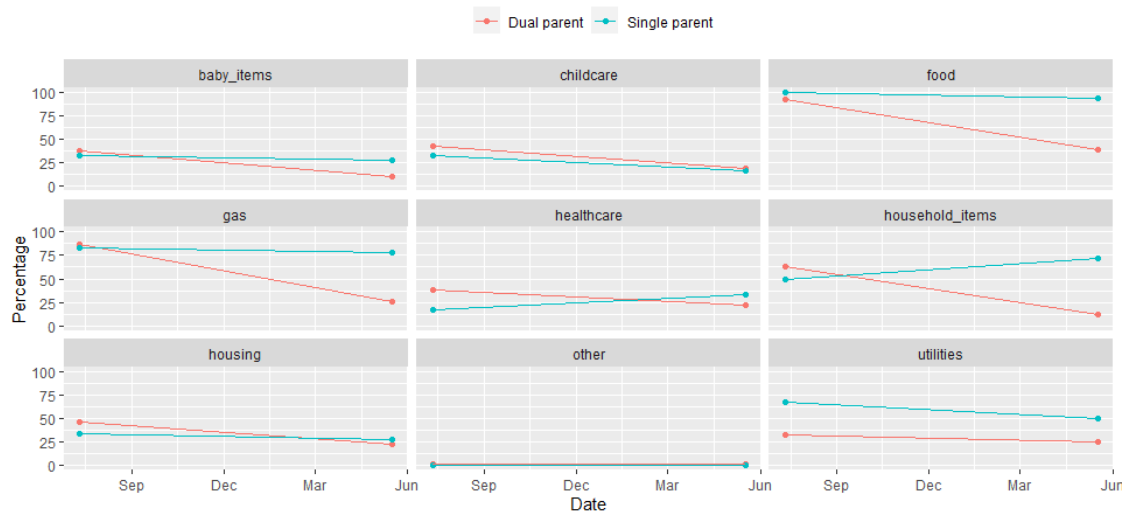

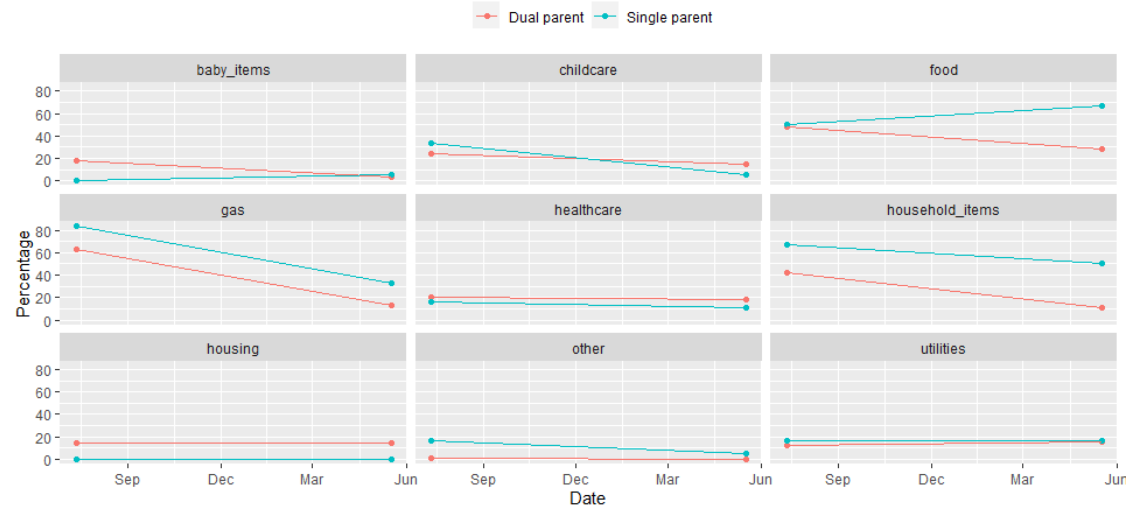
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, by single-parent status

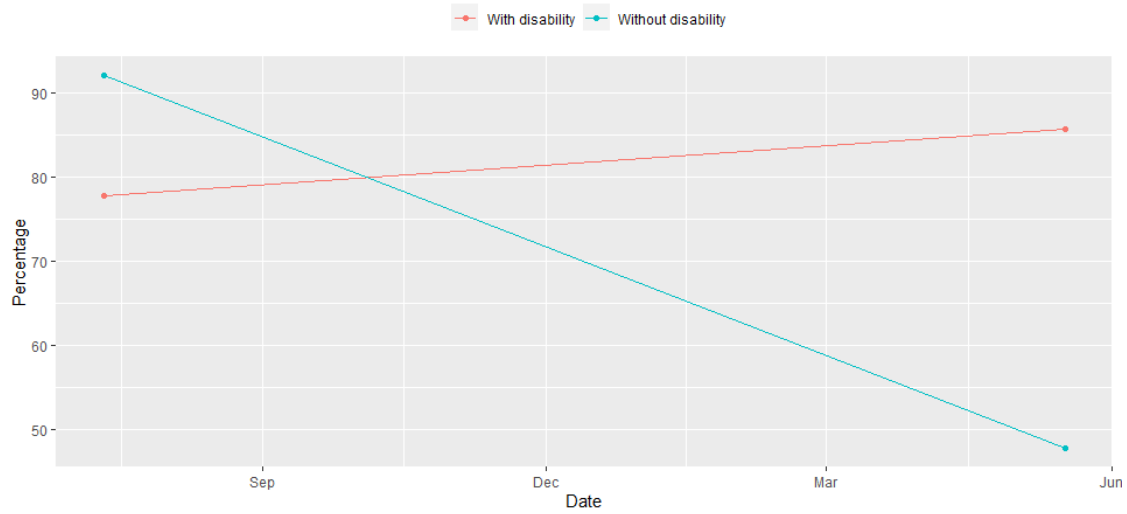

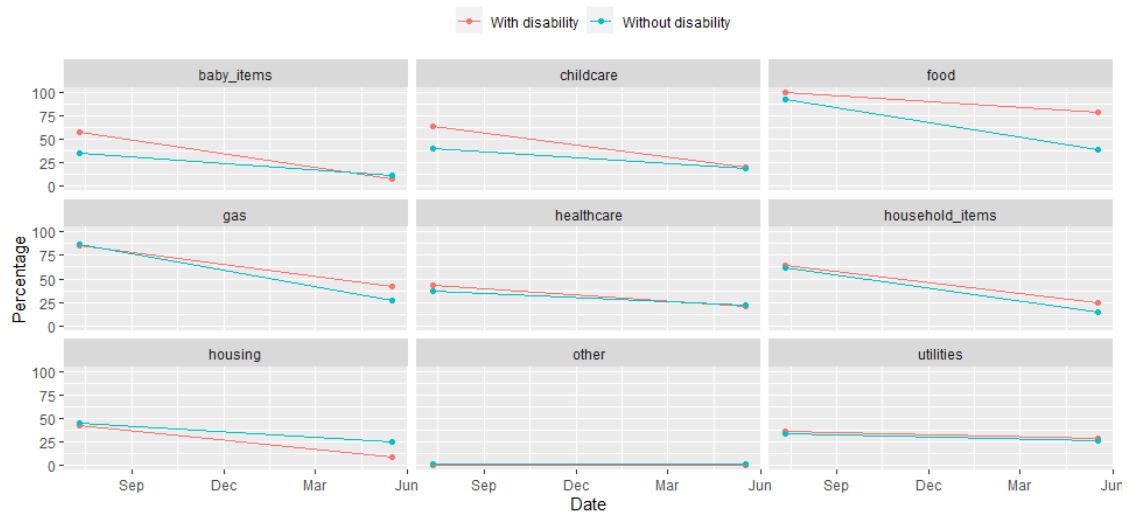

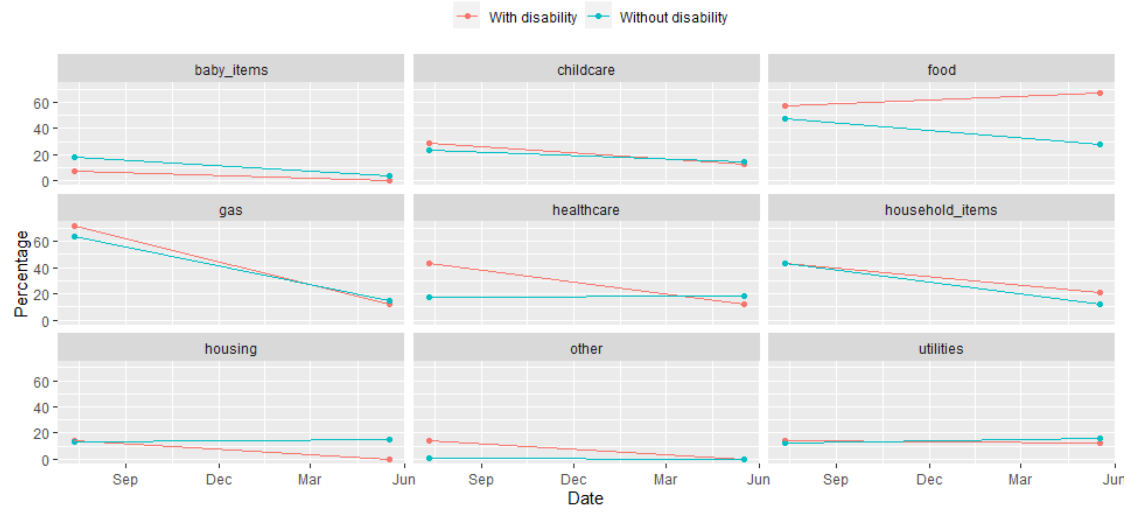
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, by child disability status

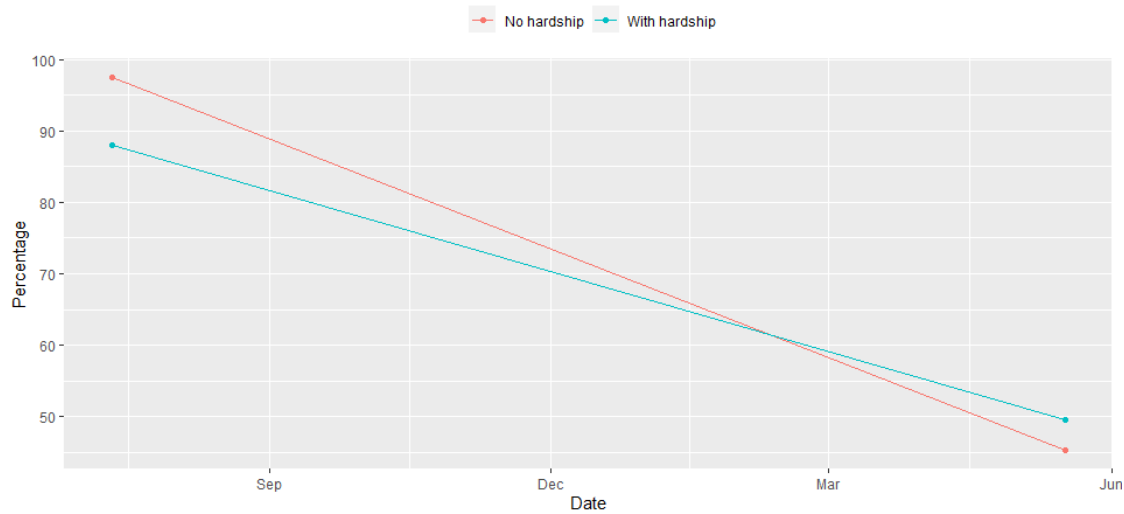

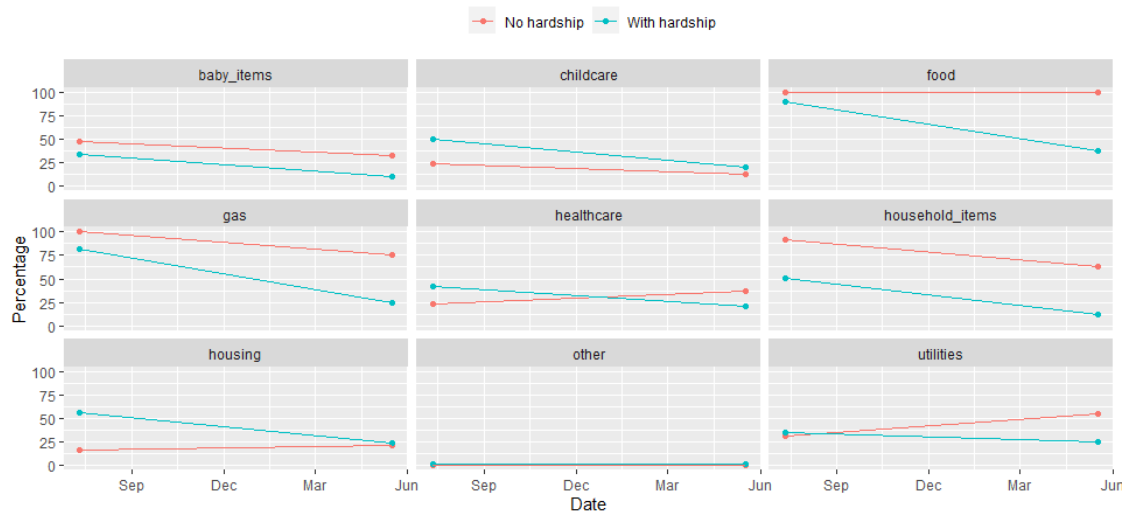

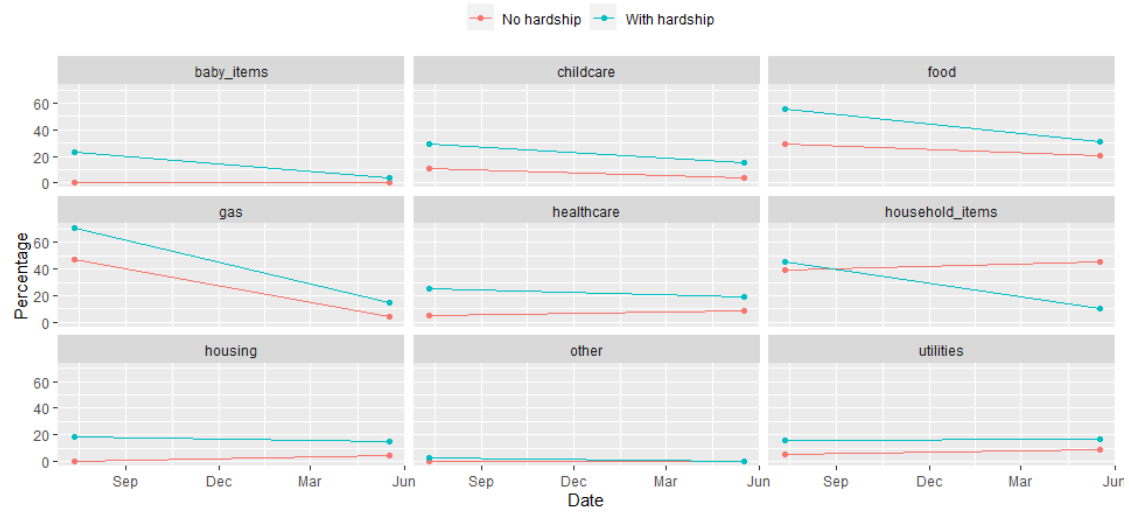
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, by material hardship status

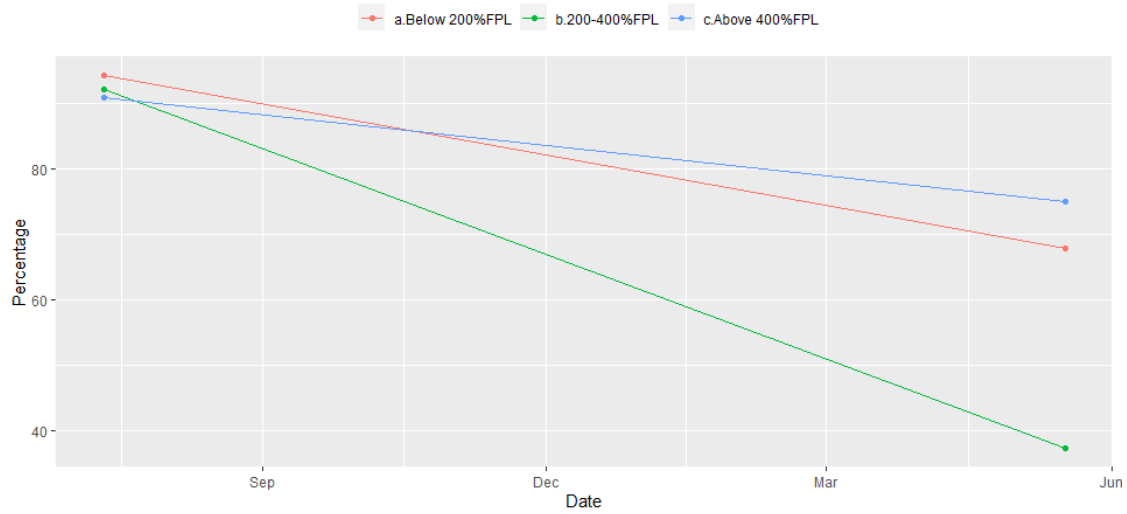

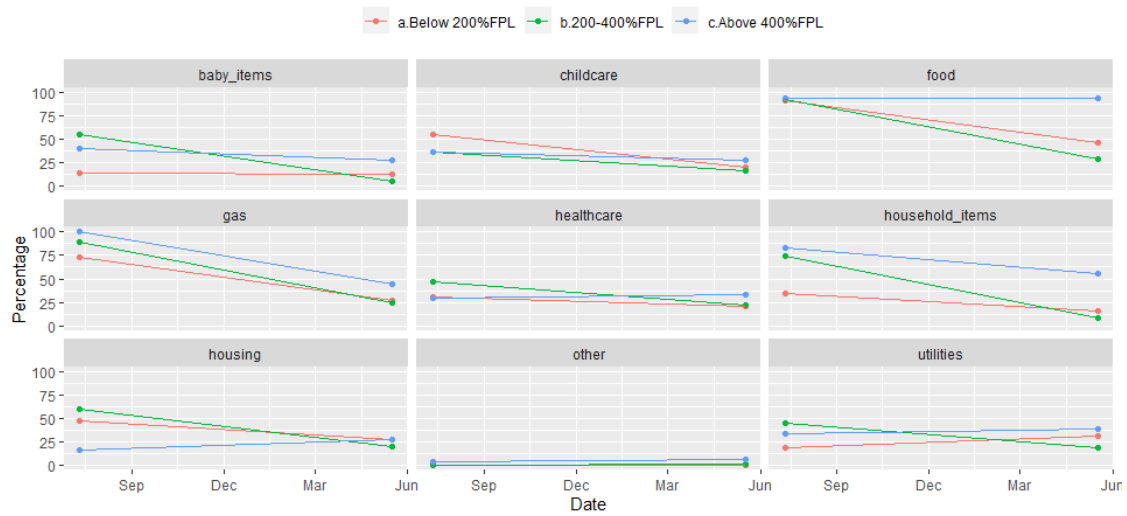

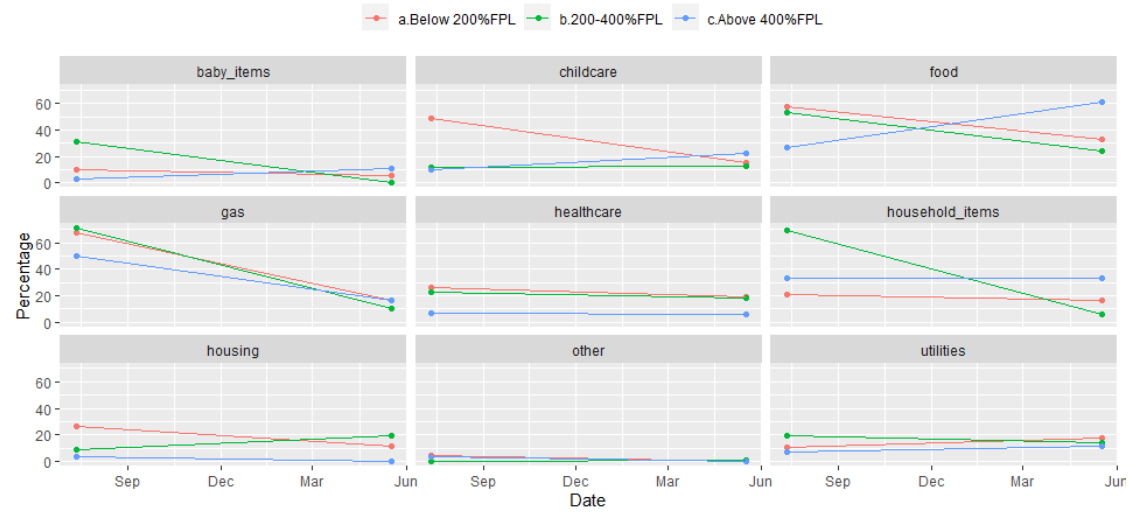
Costs for Everyday Items Have Gone Up, by income levels

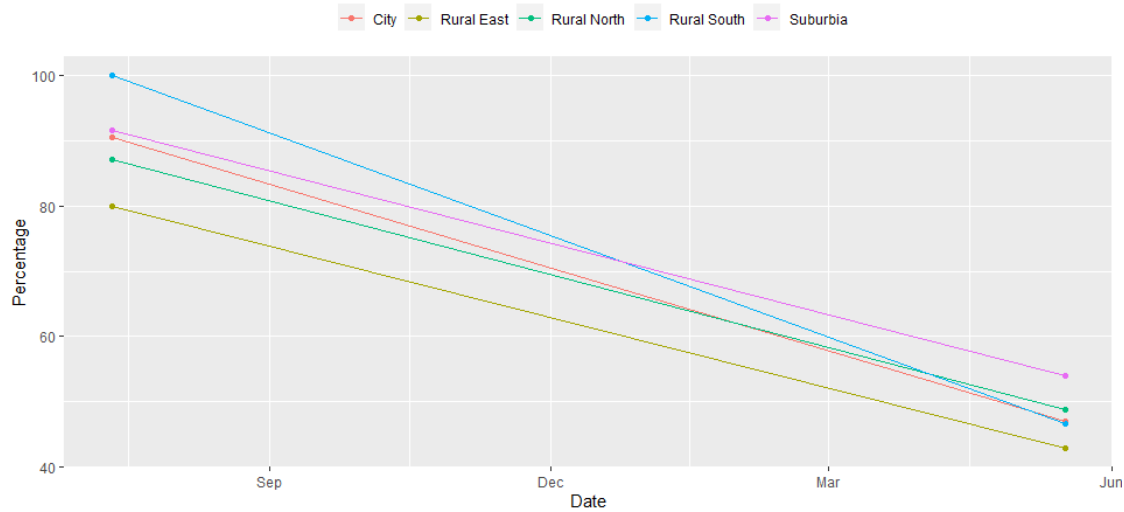

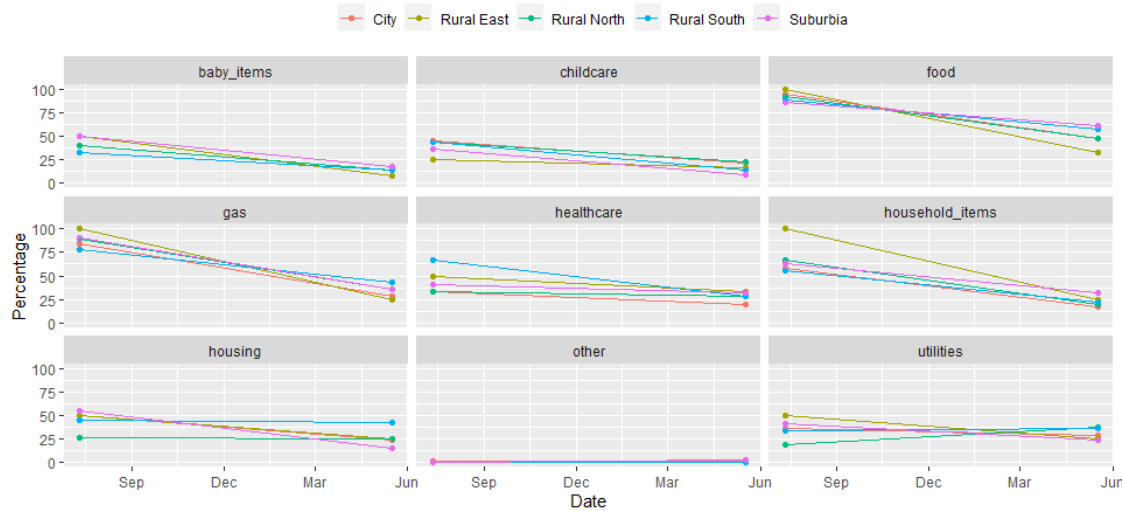
