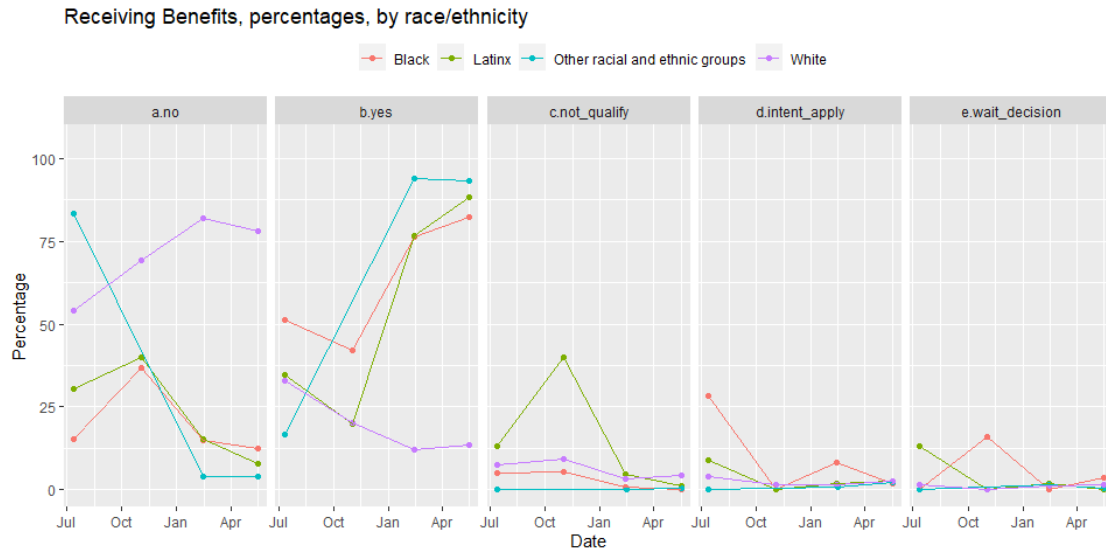

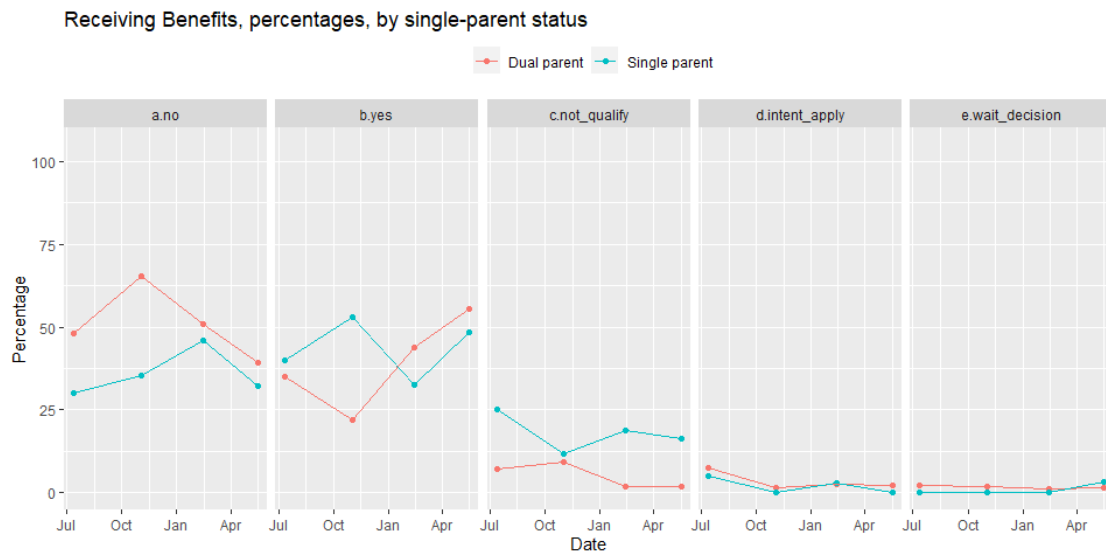

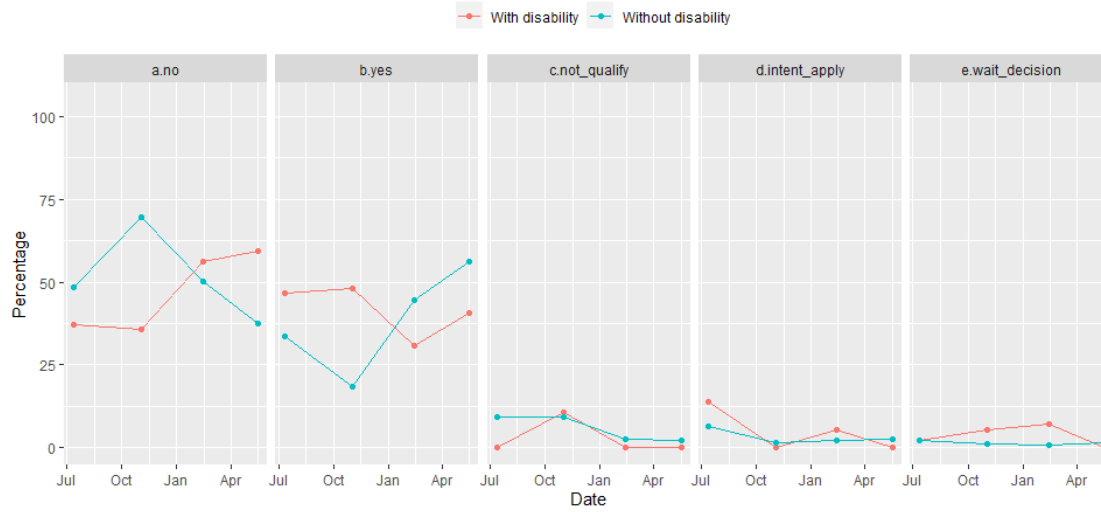

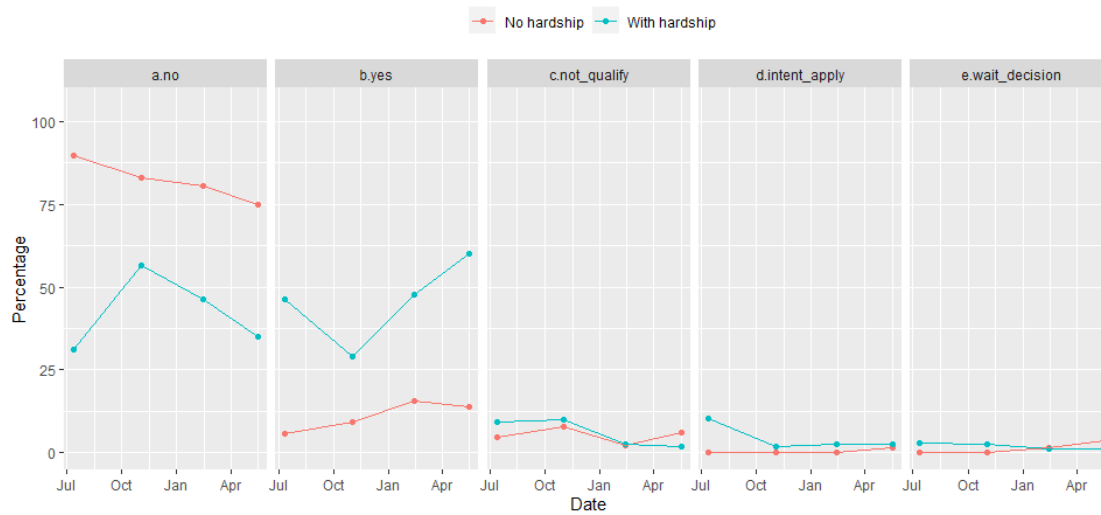

Receiving Benefits, percentages, by child disability status

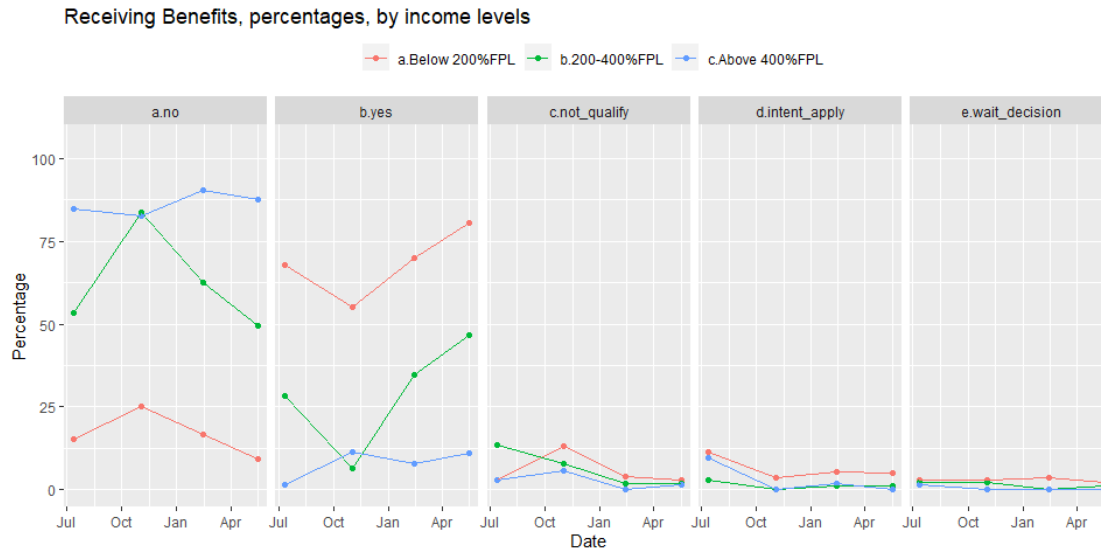

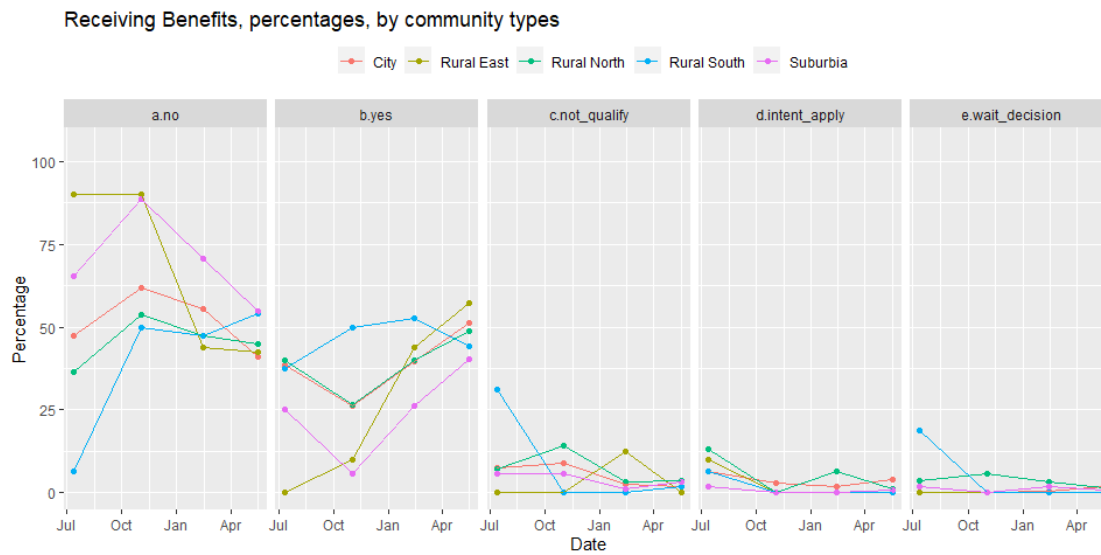
Receiving Benefits, percentages, by material hardship status

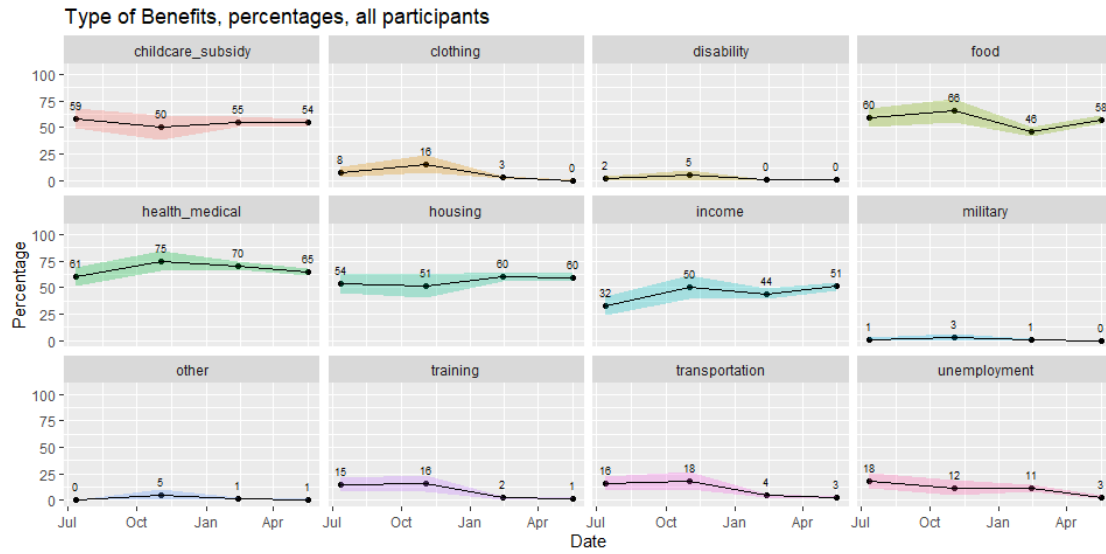

- 16 - Unemployment benefit

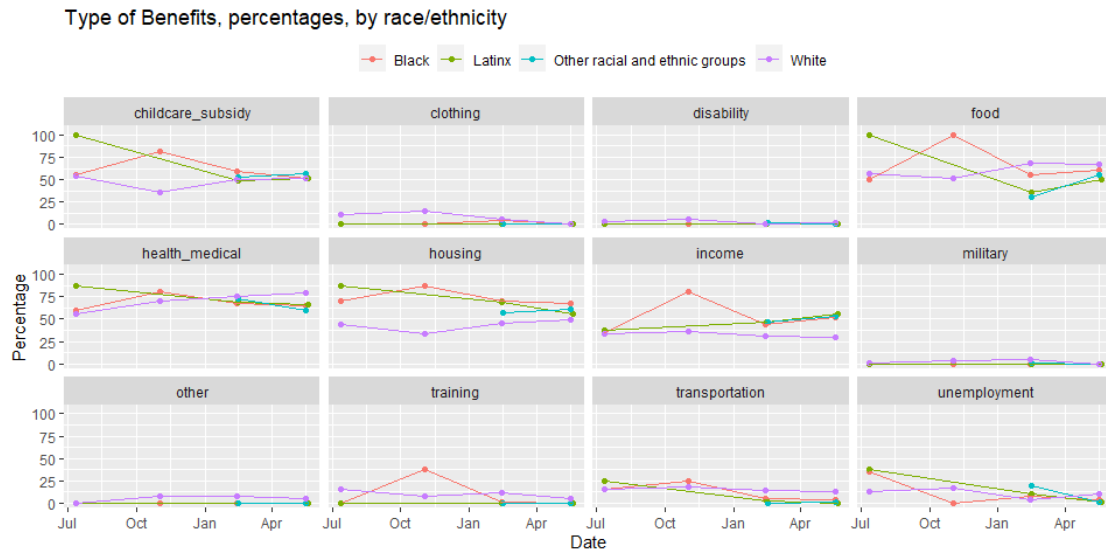

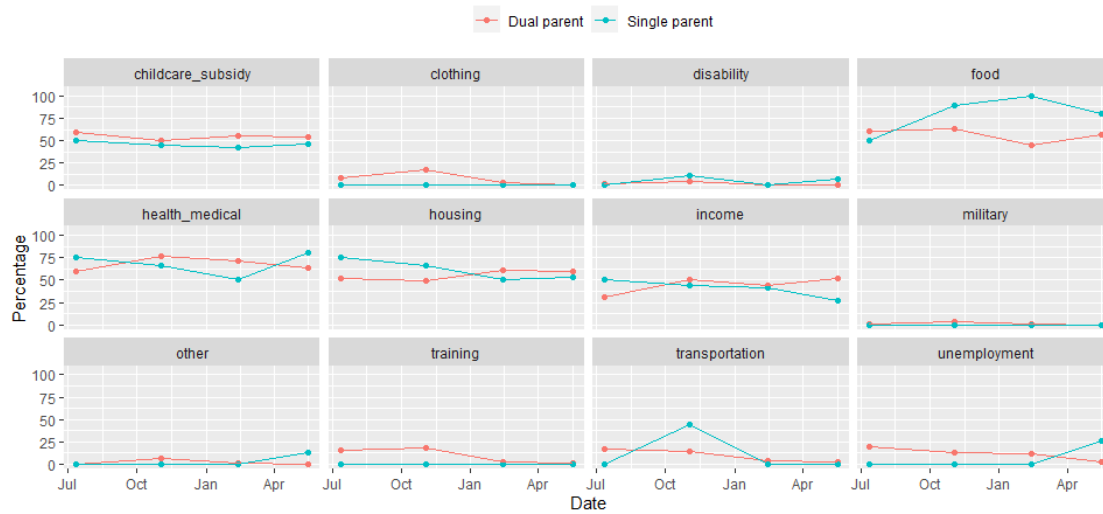

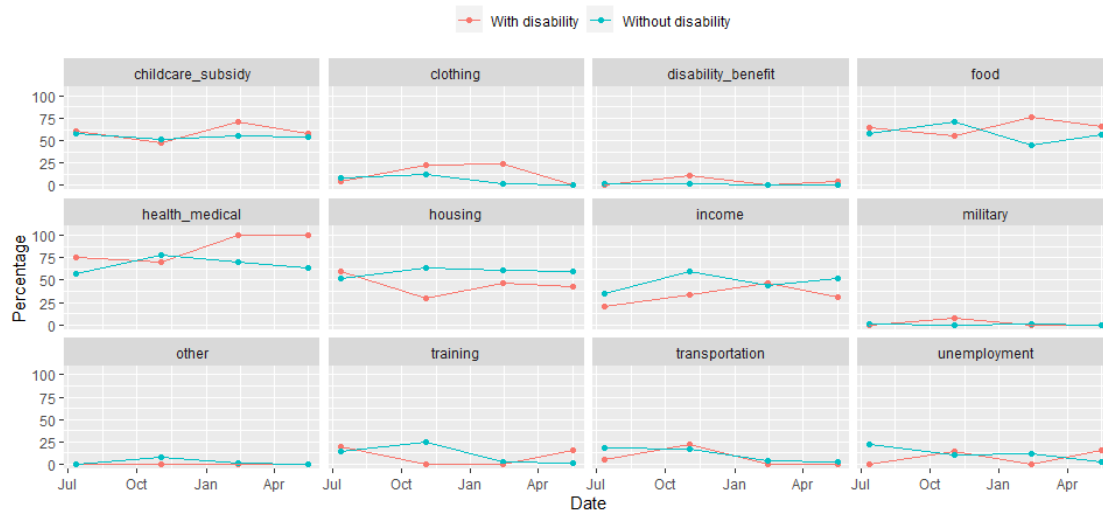

Type of Benefits, percentages, by single-parent status

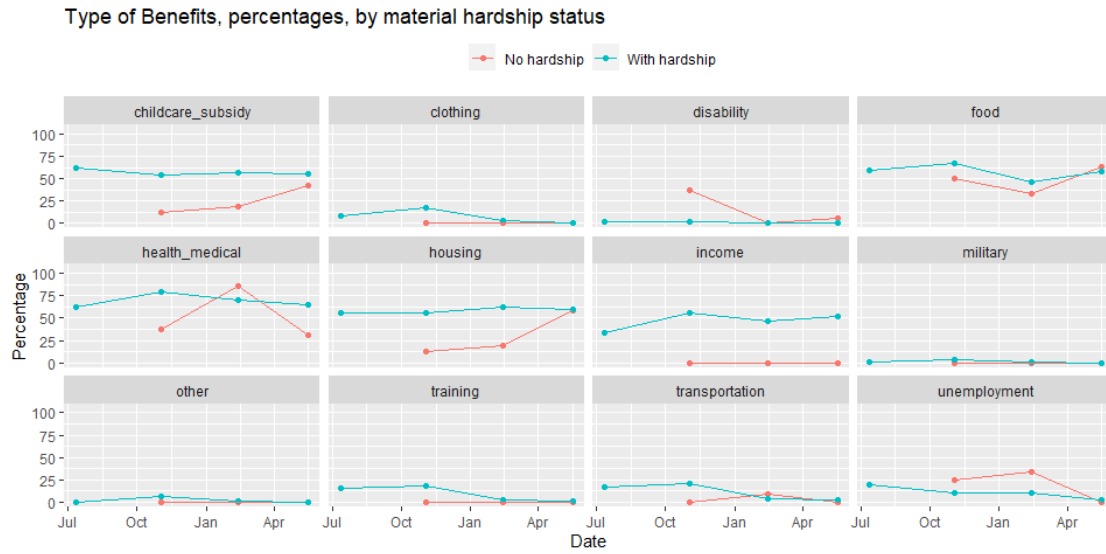

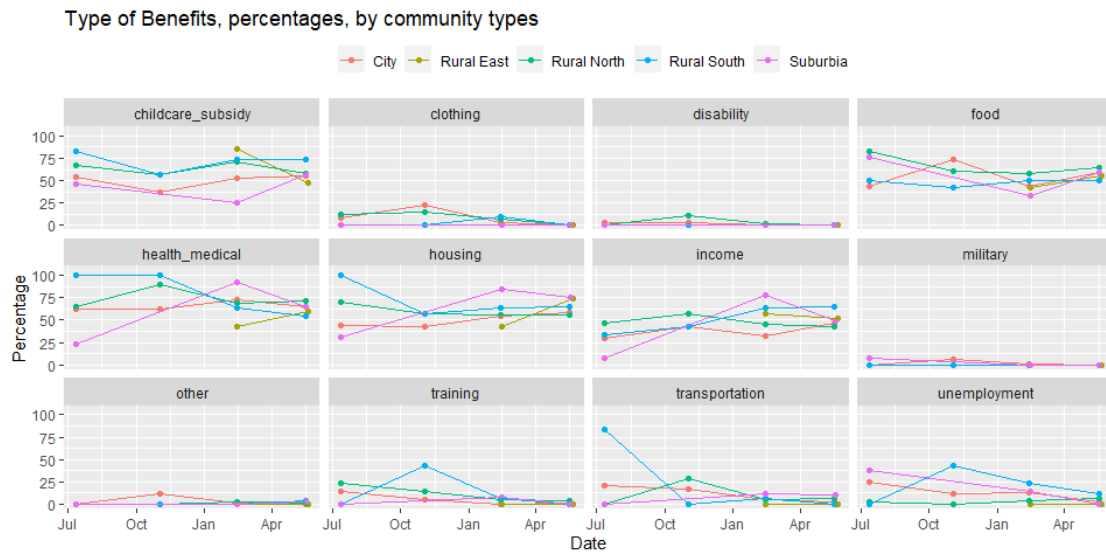

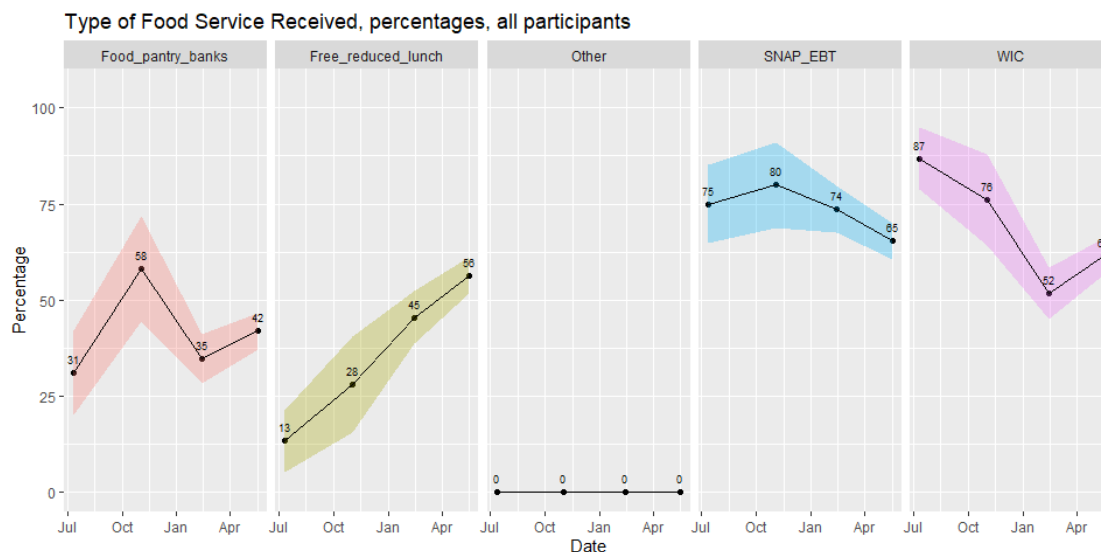
2. Types of food service received

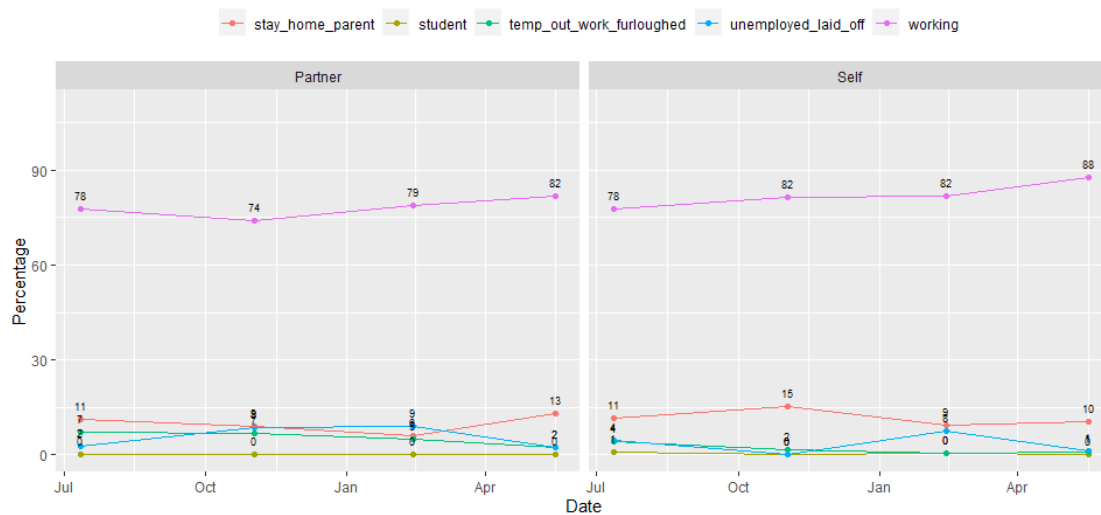
3.1 Employment status

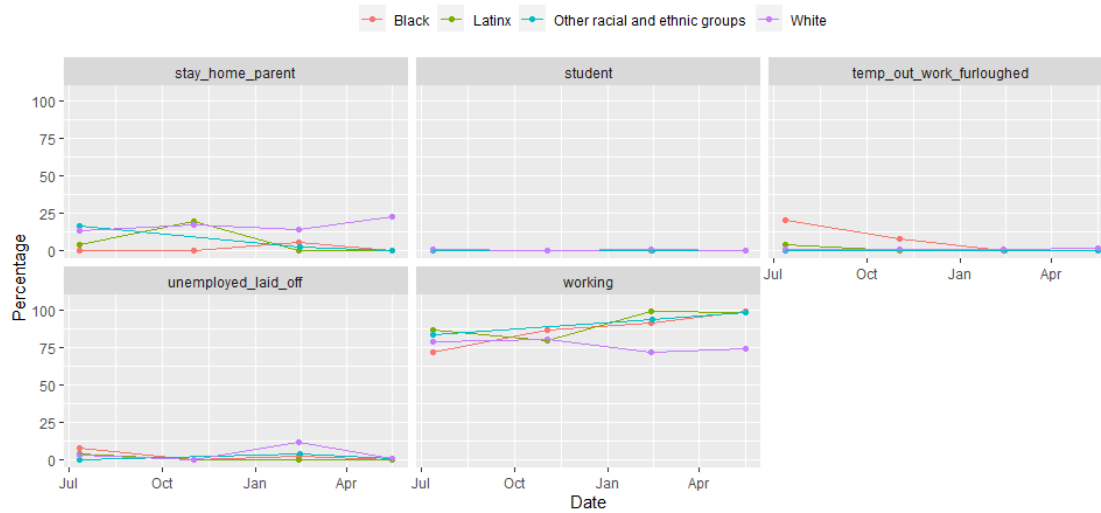
Employment Status of Self and Partner, all participants



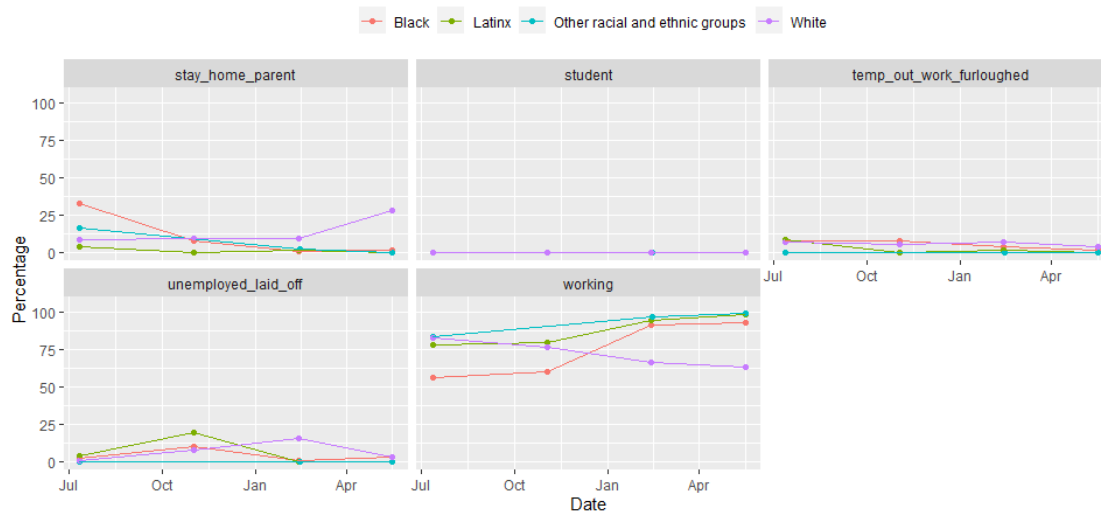

Current Employment Status of Self, by race/ethnicity



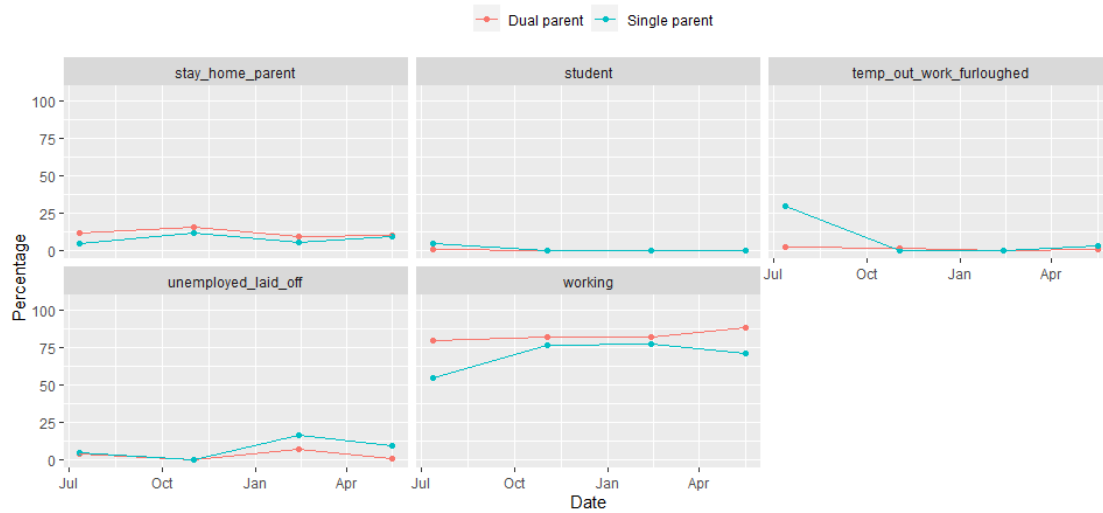
Current Employment Status of Partner, by race/ethnicity



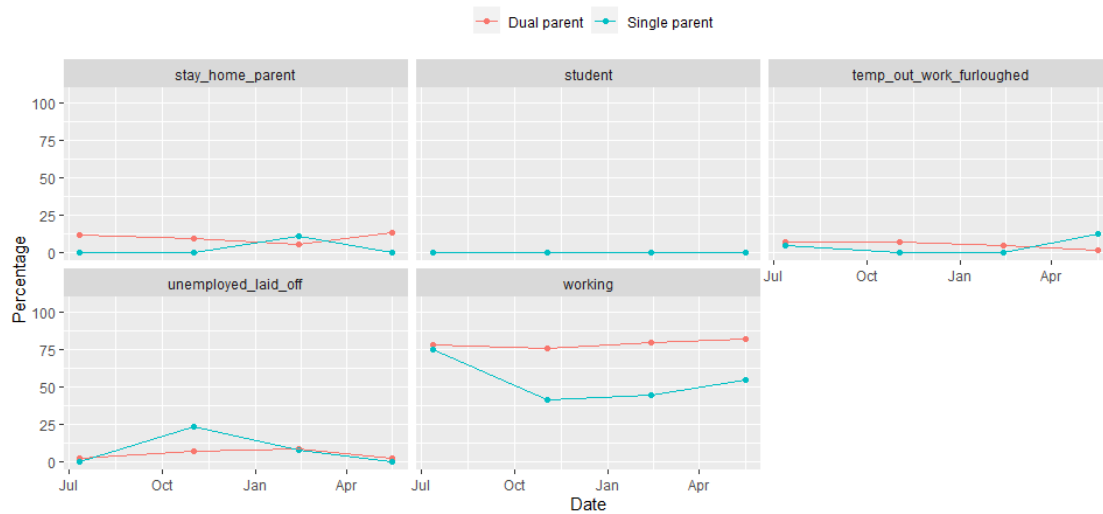

Current Employment Status of Self, by single-parent status



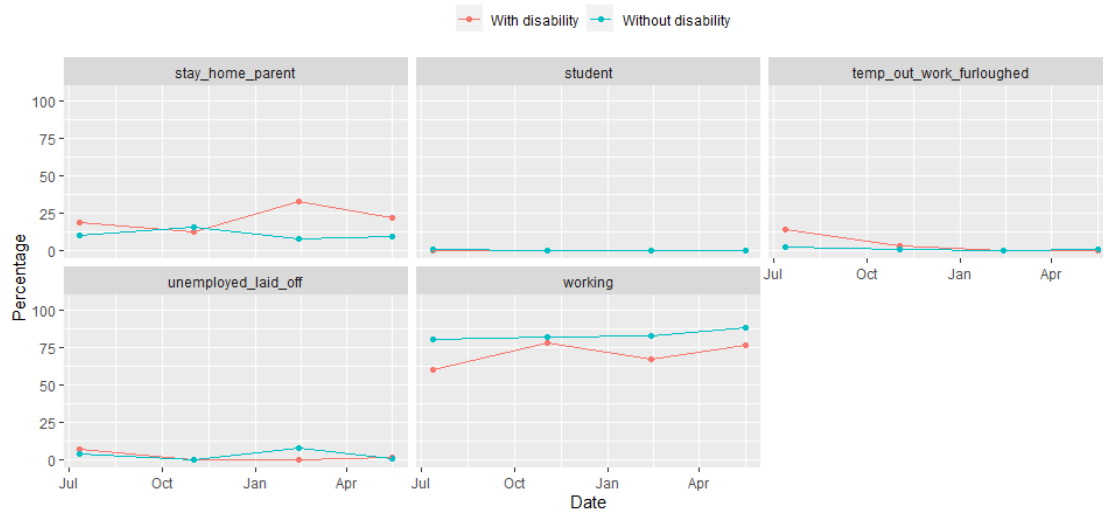
Current Employment Status of Partner, by single-parent status



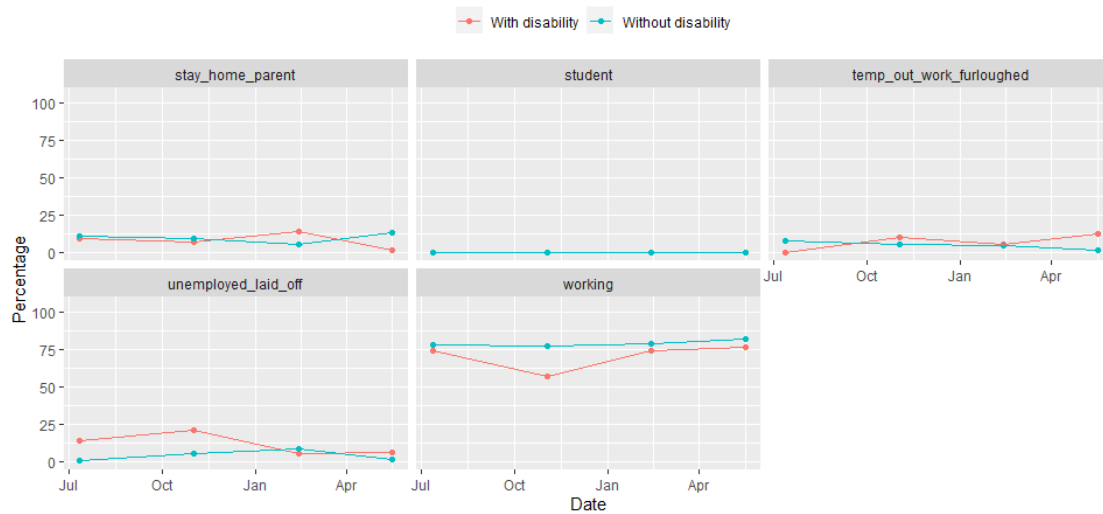

Current Employment Status of Self, by child disability status



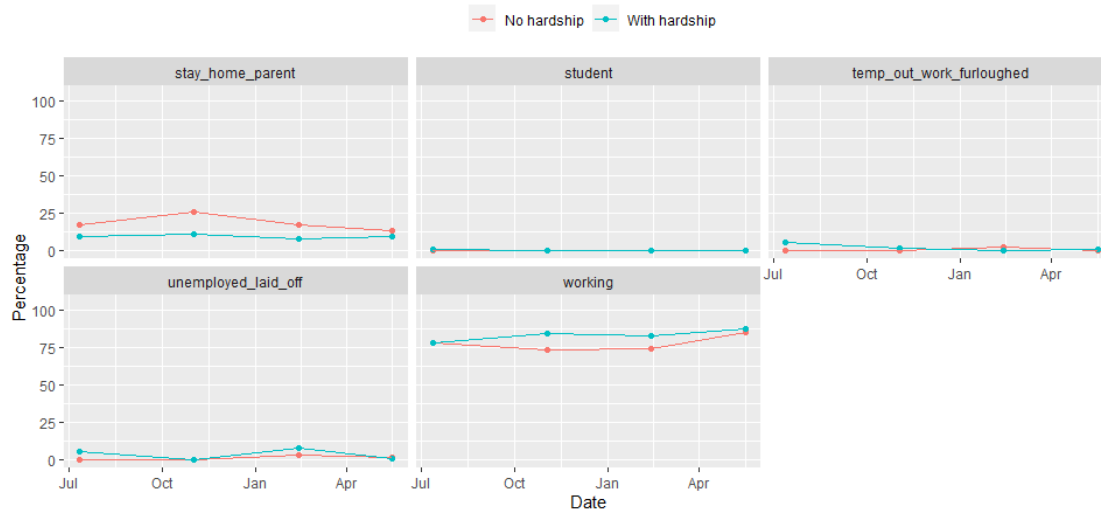
Current Employment Status of Partner, by child disability status



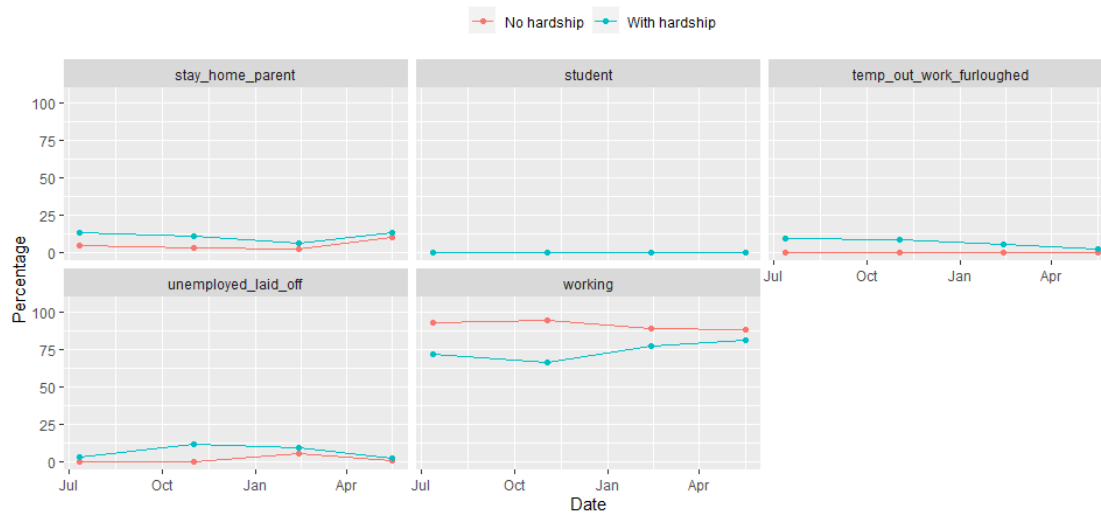

Current Employment Status of Self, by material hardship status



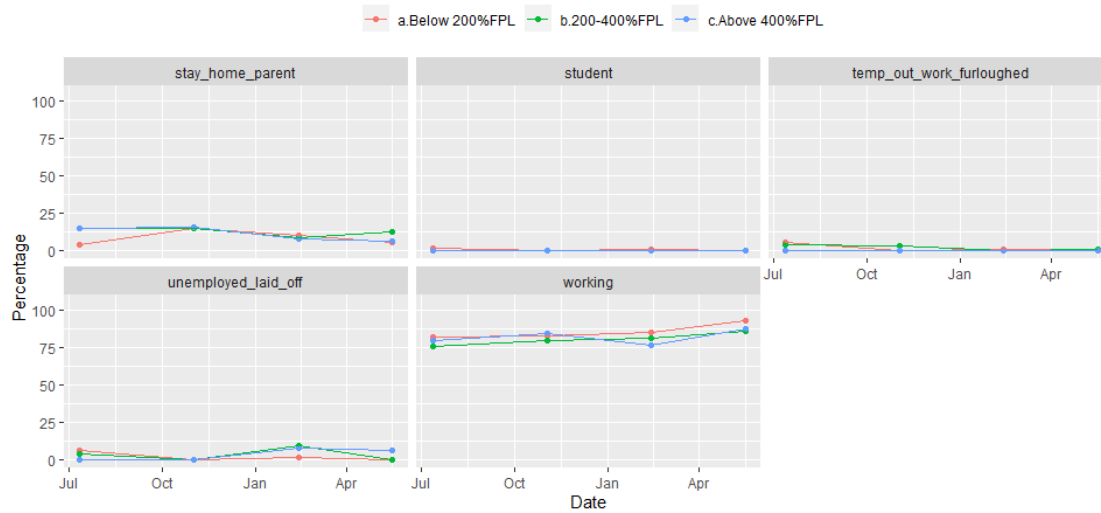
Current Employment Status of Partner, by material hardship status



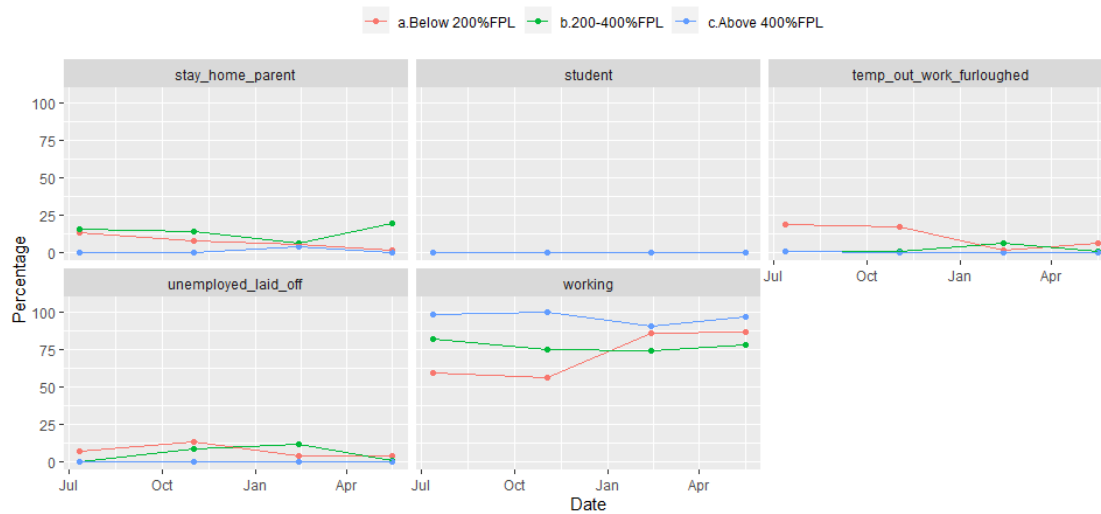

Current Employment Status of Self, by income levels



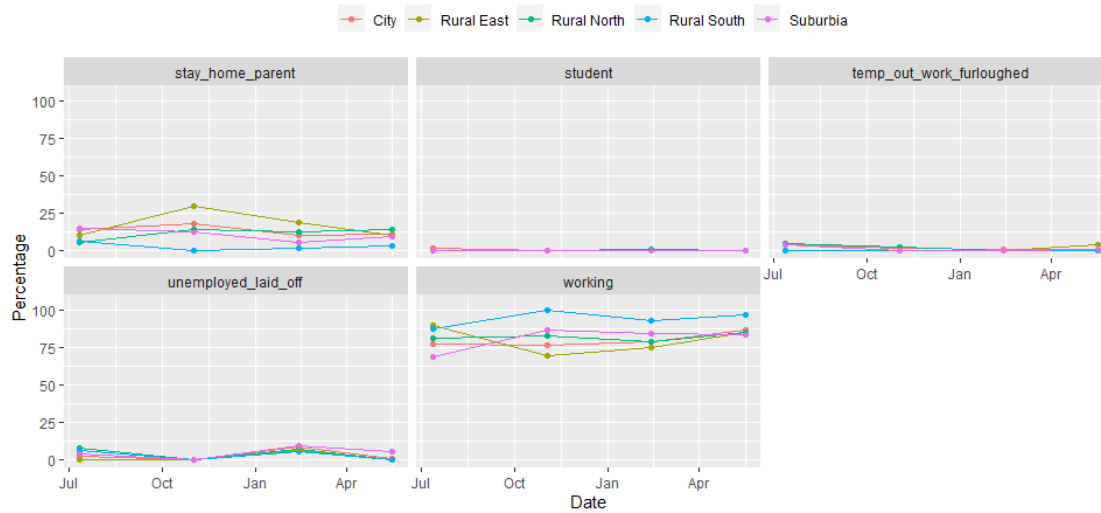

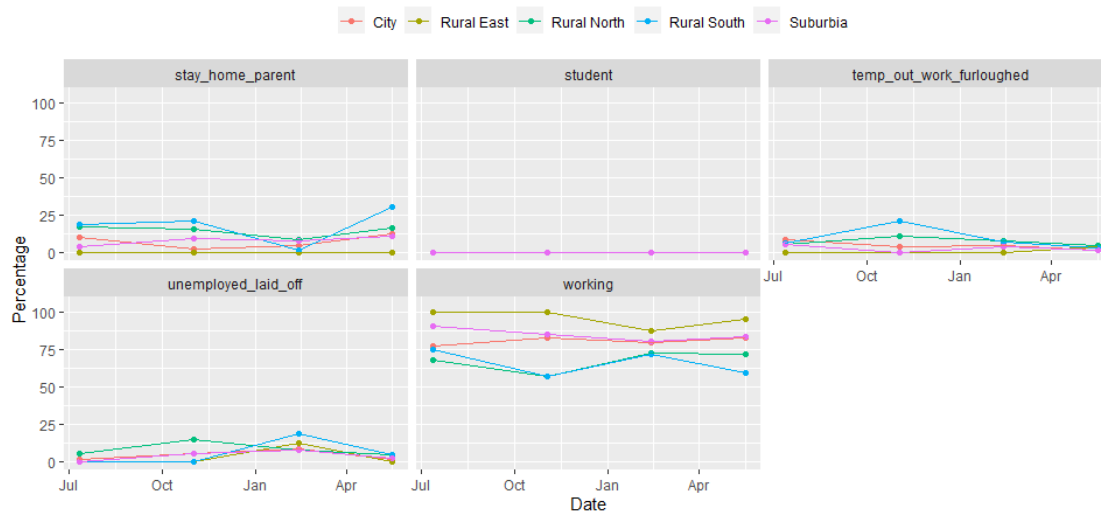

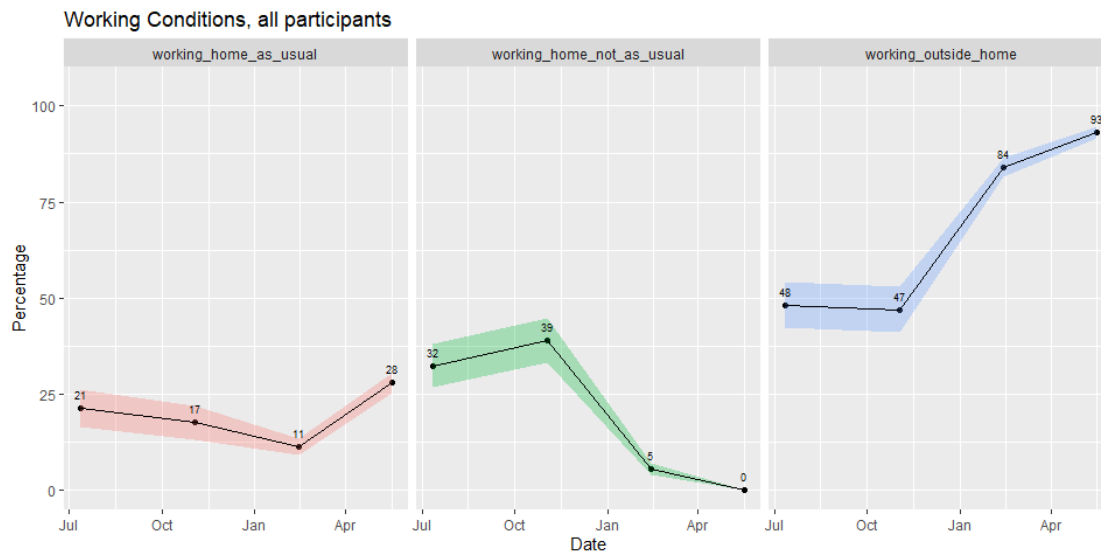
3.2 Current working environment

- Employed and working outside the home

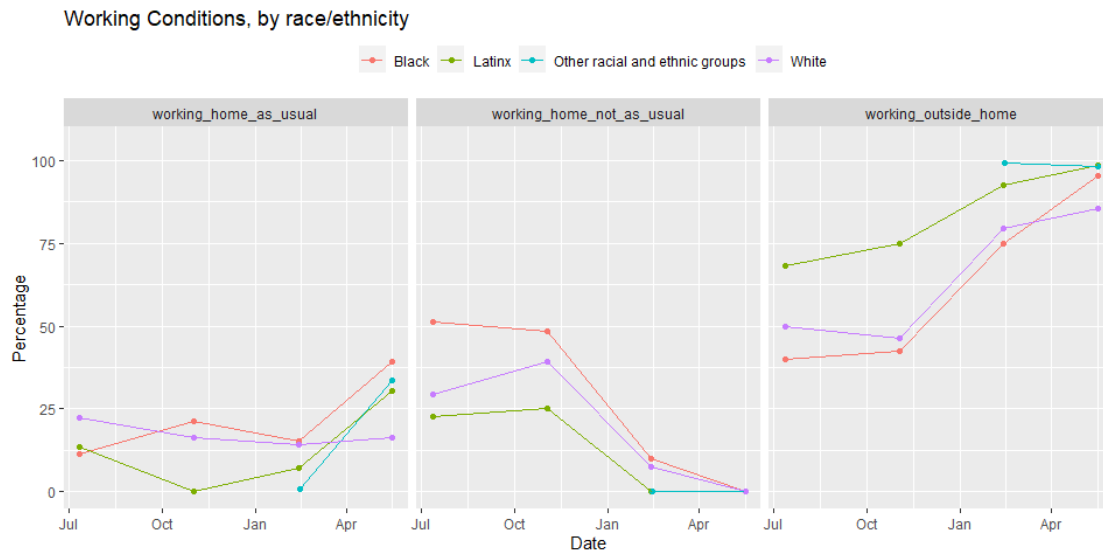

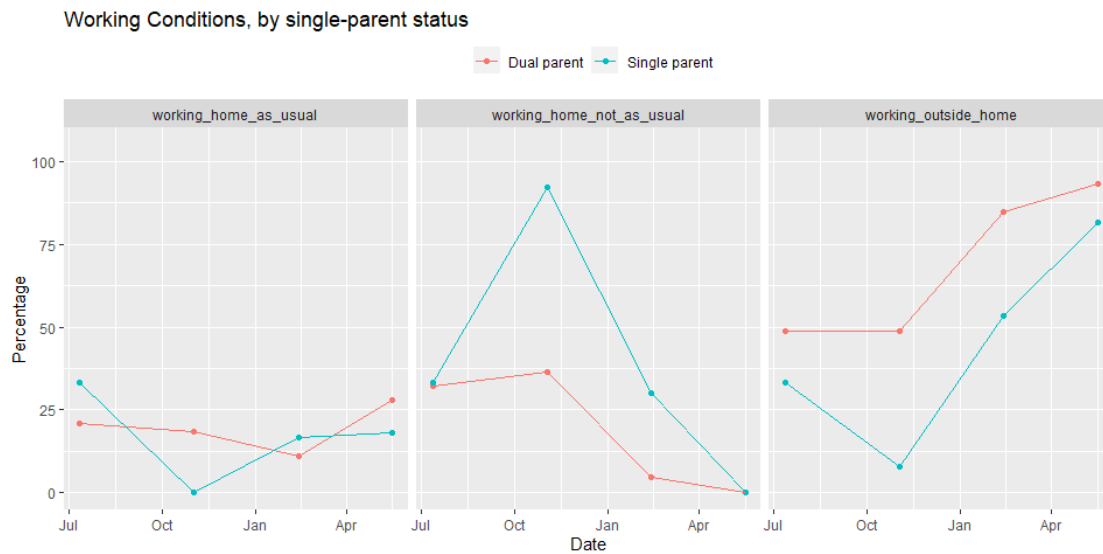

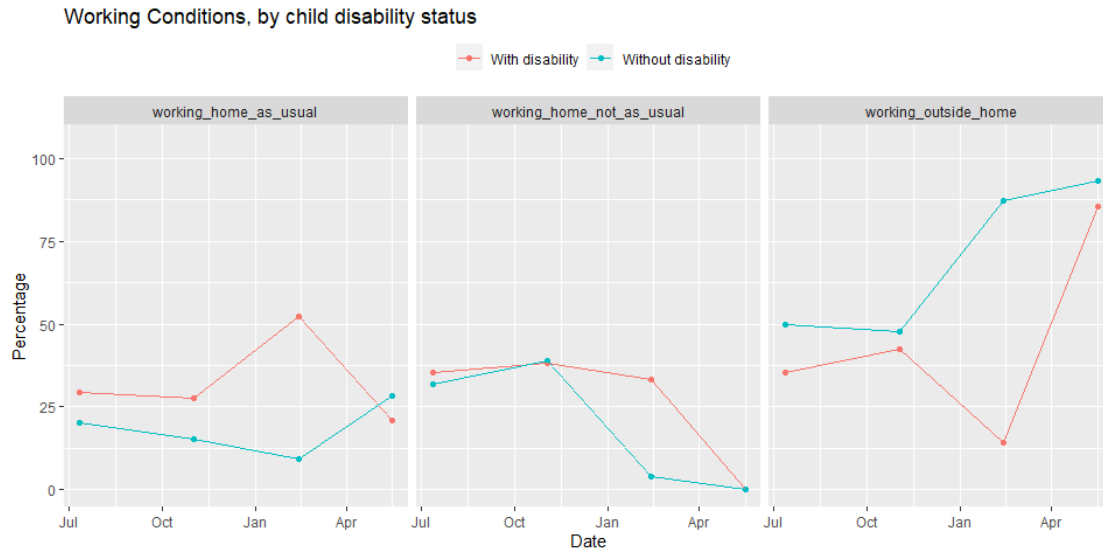

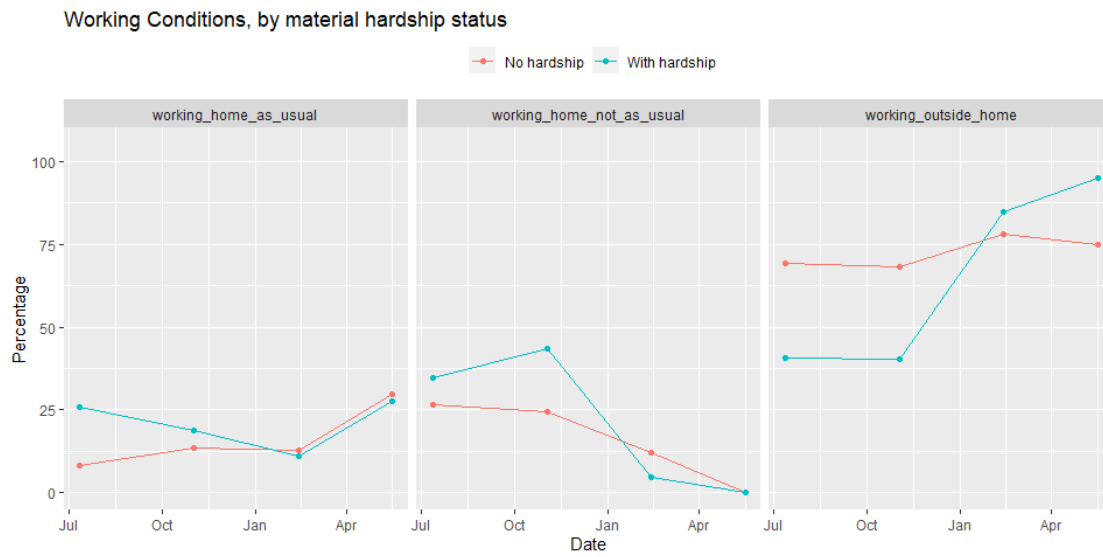

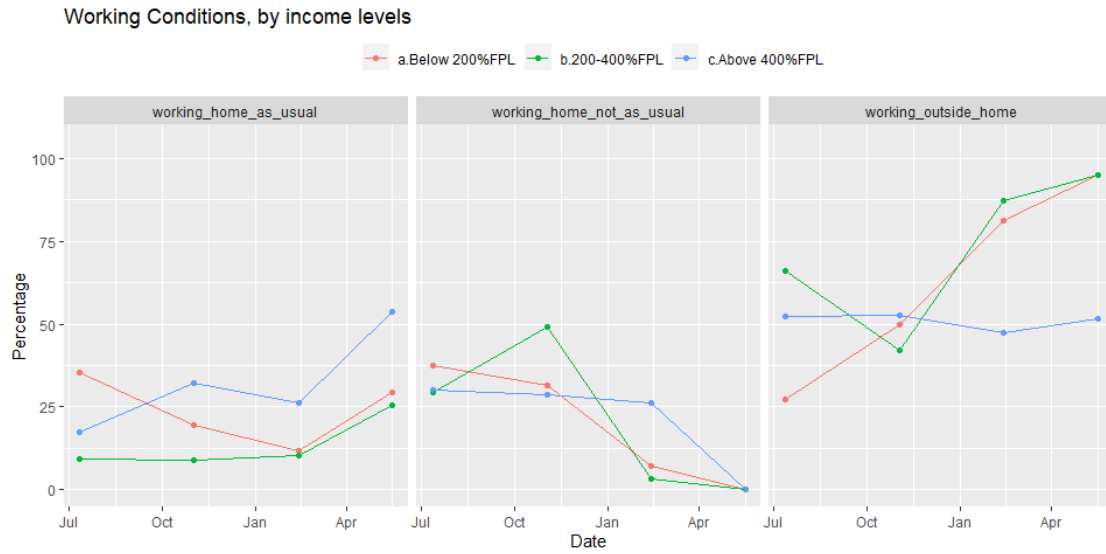

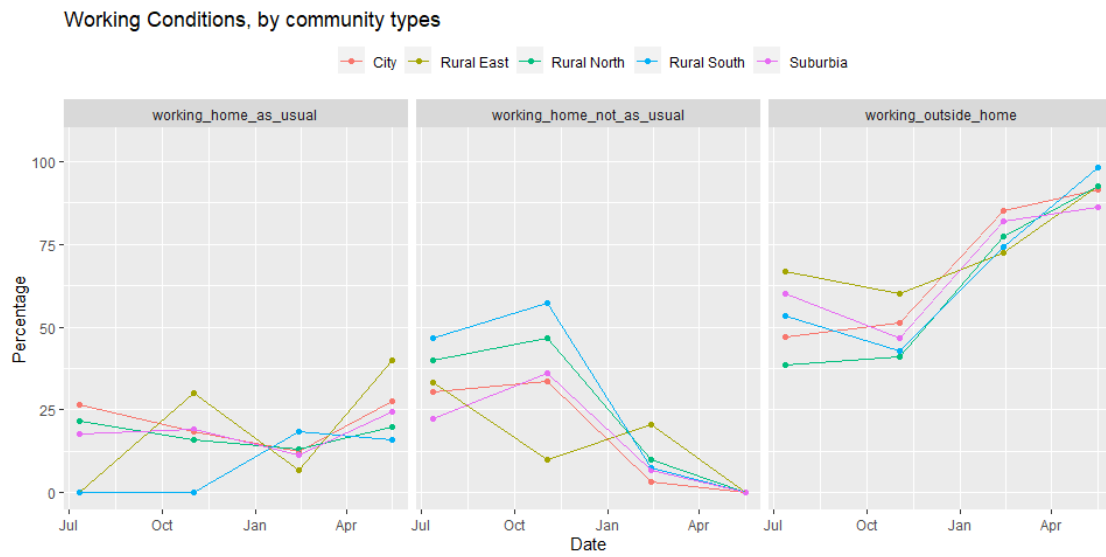

Lose job if sick for 2 weeks - very unlikely/unlikely/neutral/likely/very likely/NA

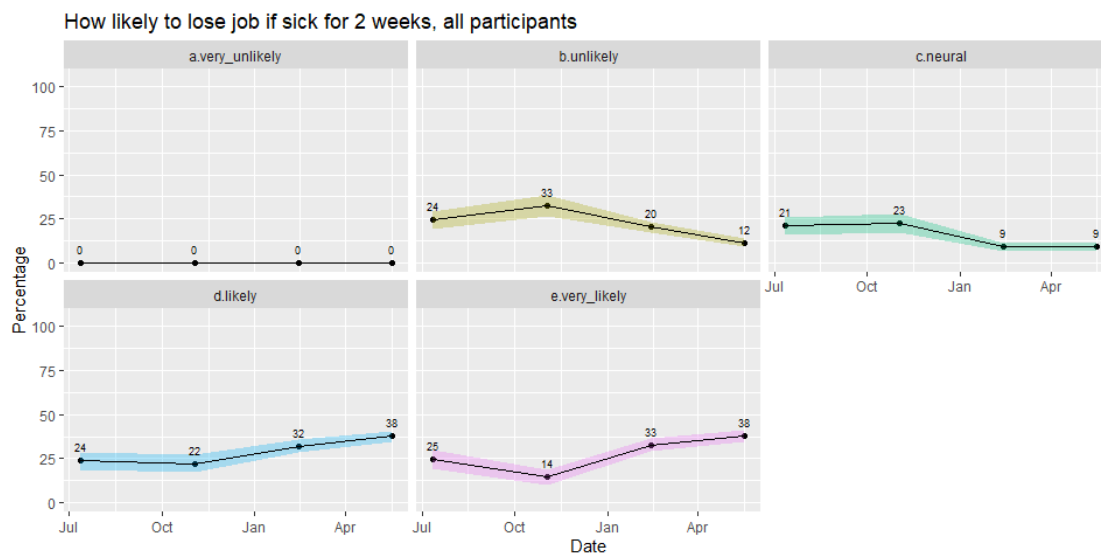
Among all participants in Ongoing Assessment 1, 64.6% (n = 203) reported that their employment offers sick leave

Among all participants in Ongoing Assessment 2, 61.4% (n = 197) reported that their employment offers sick leave

Among all participants in Ongoing Assessment 3, 69.7% (n = 712) reported that their employment offers sick leave

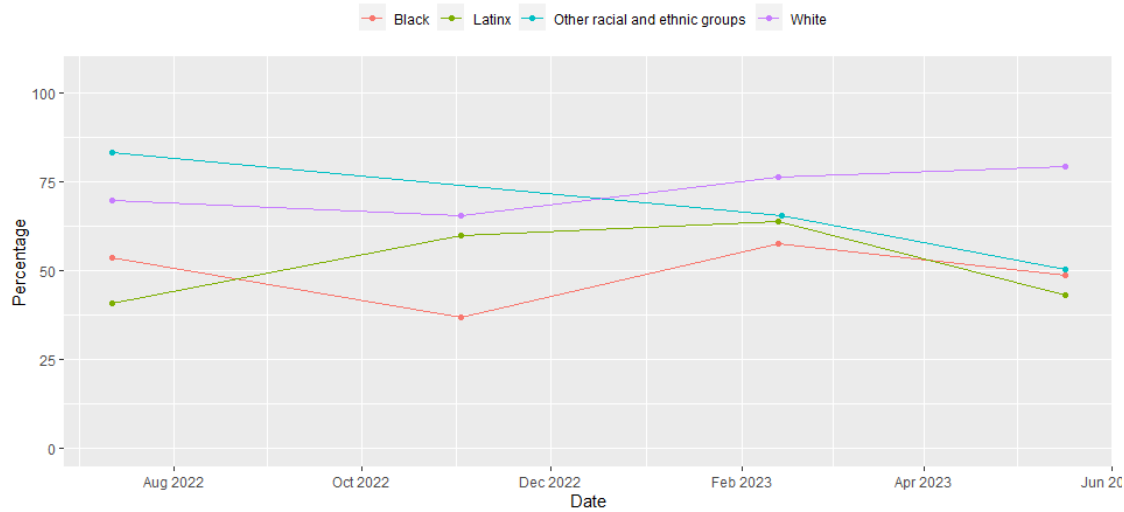
Among all participants in Ongoing Assessment 4, 62.1% (n = 794) reported that their employment offers sick leave

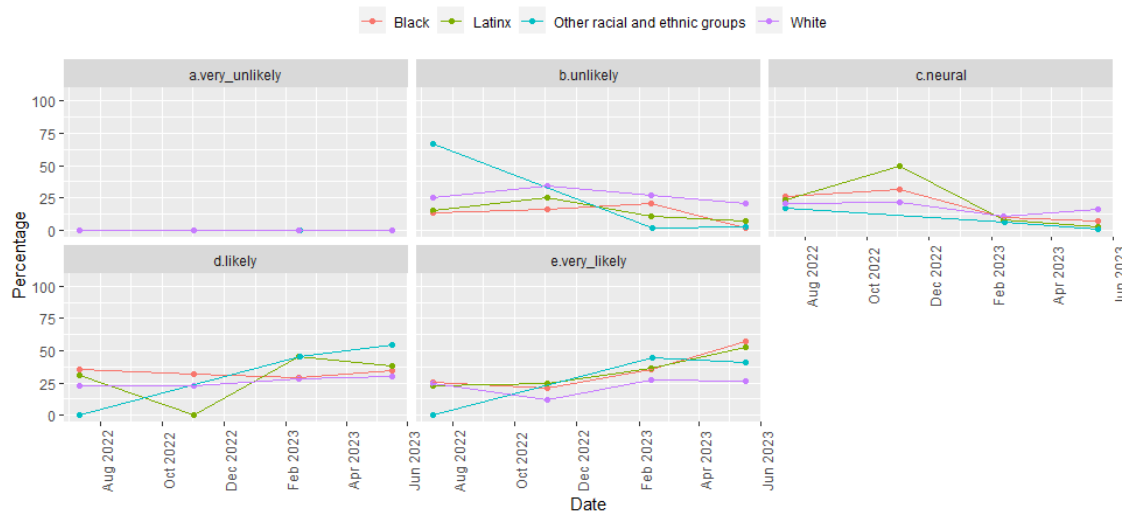

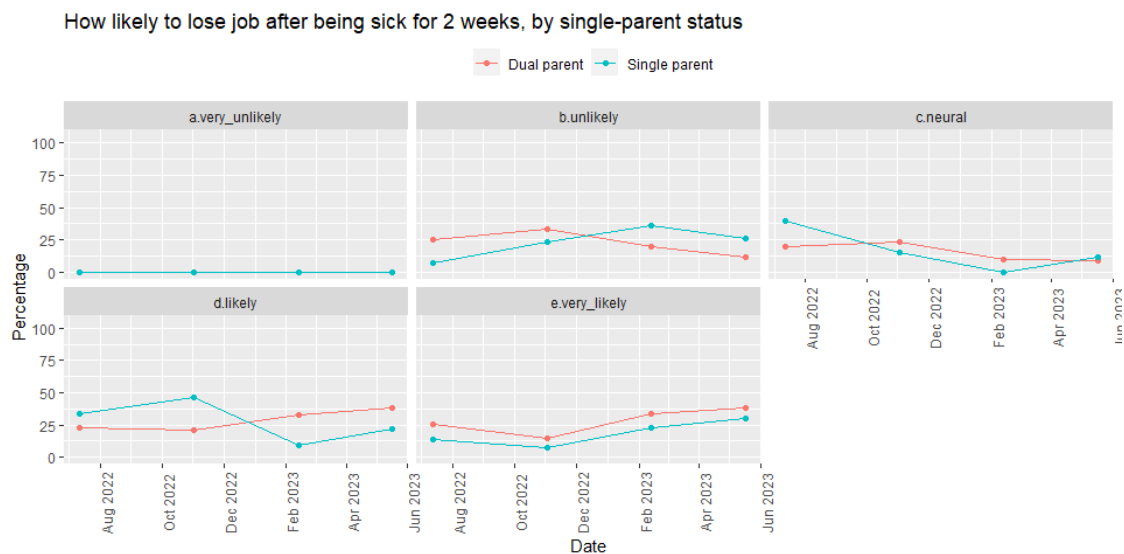
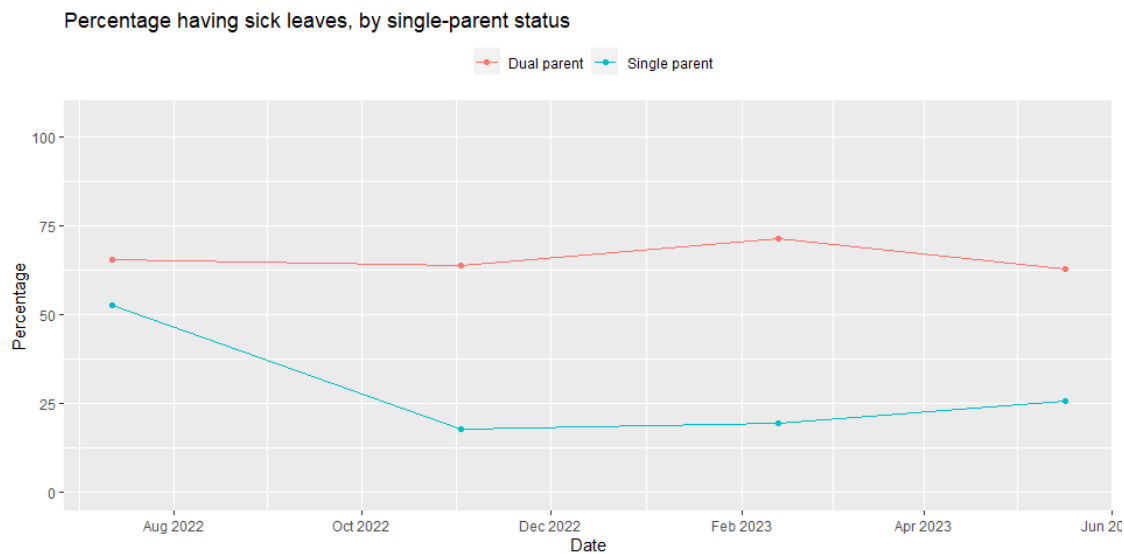
Percentage having sick leaves, by race/ethnicity



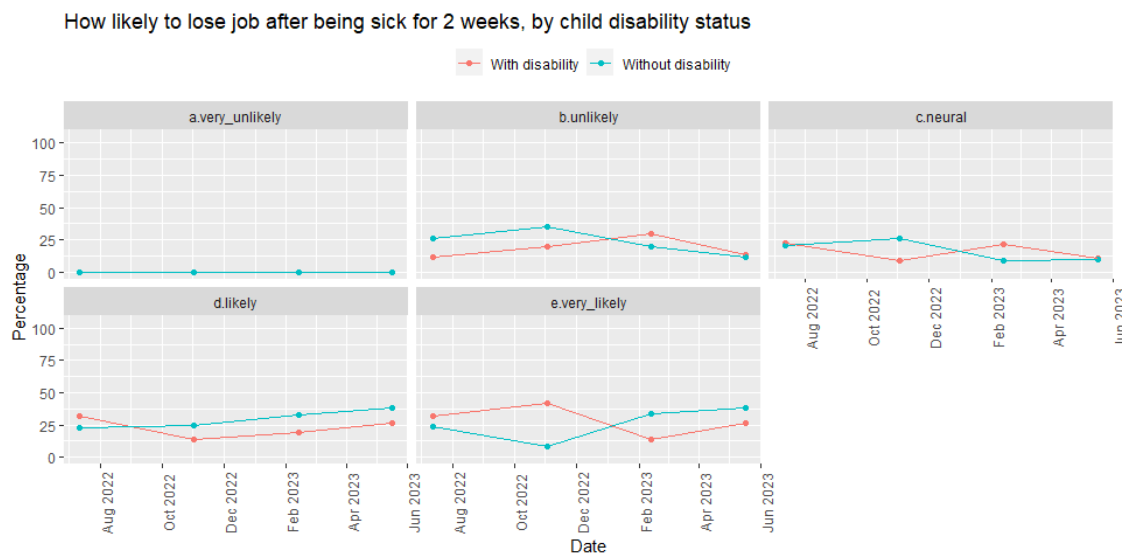
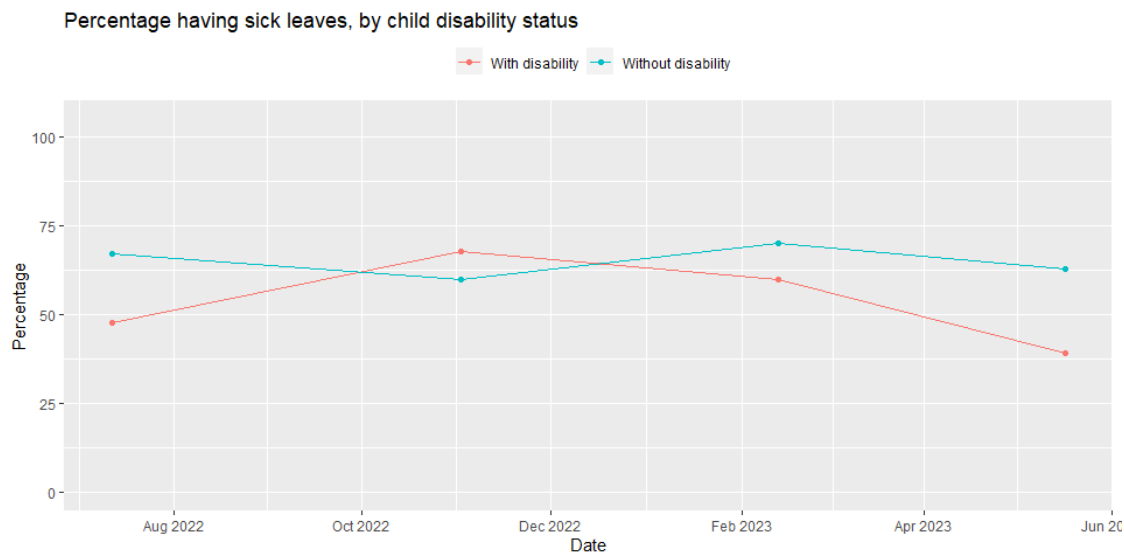
How likely to lose job after being sick for 2 weeks, by race/ethnicity



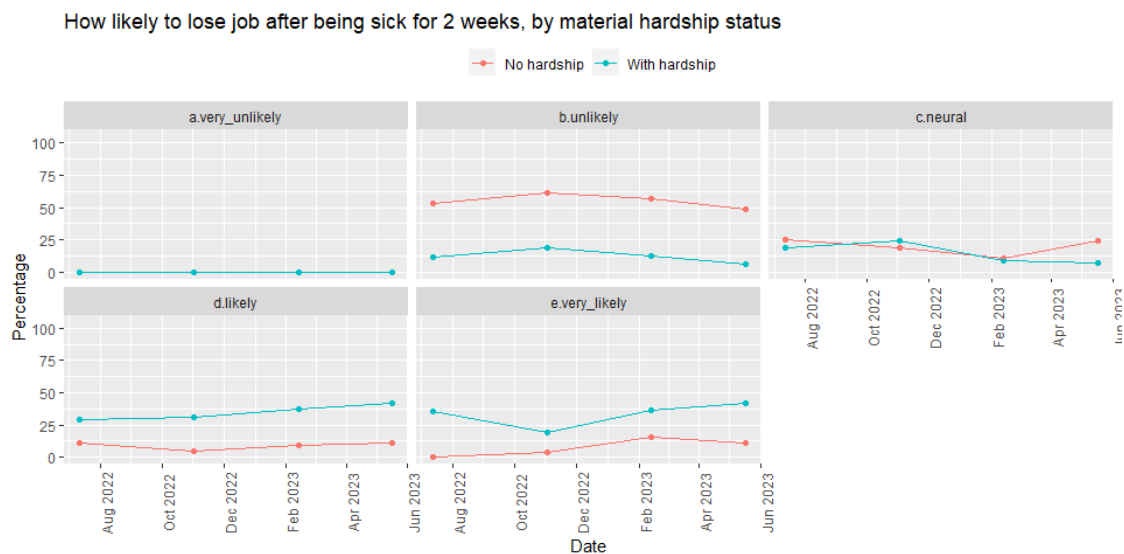
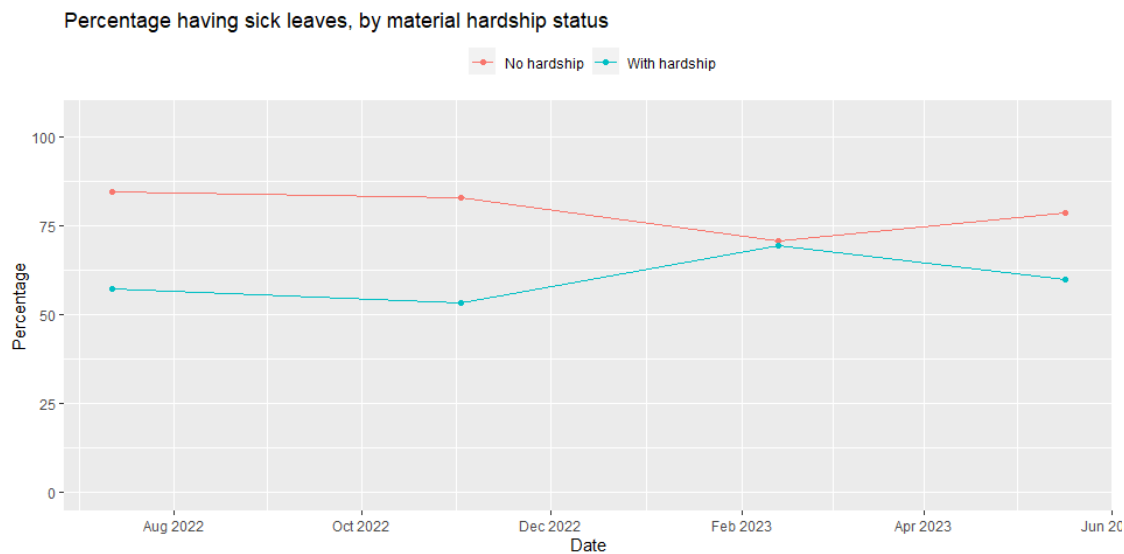

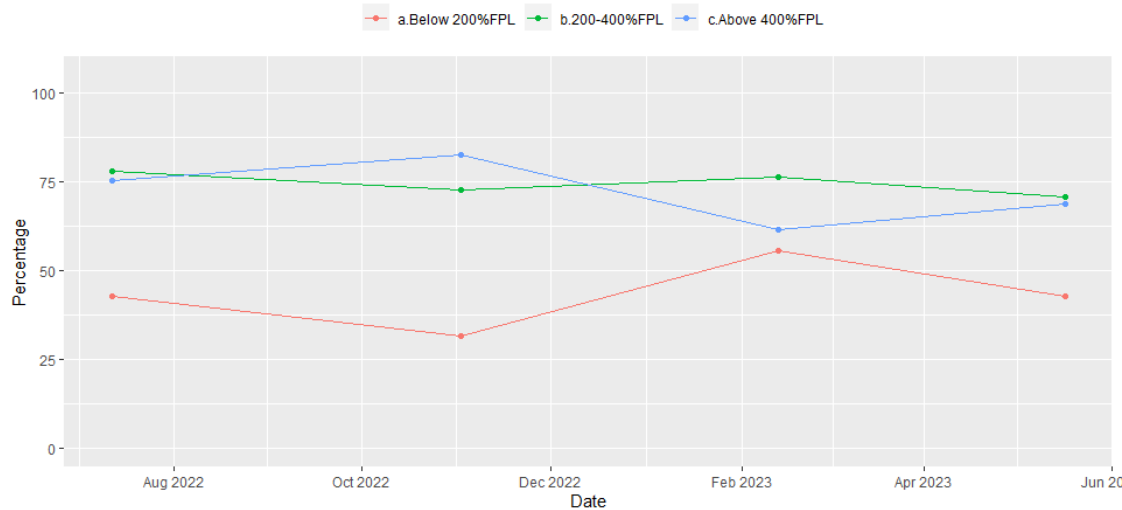

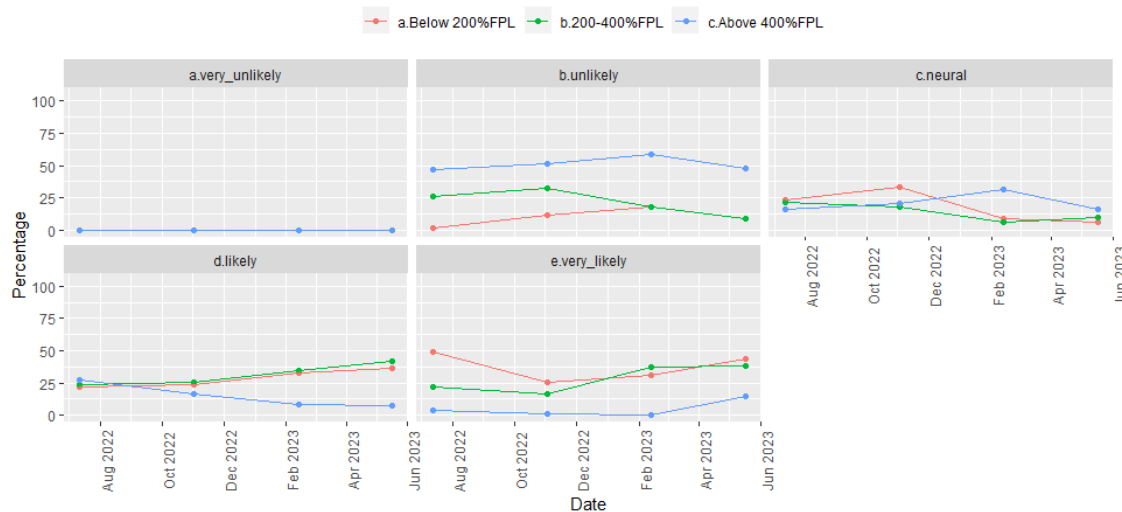
